## Eating off campus

To get to most restaurants in St. Louis, you need to bike, drive, or take the MetroLink train. The Delmar Loop and Central West End metro stops are two good neighborhoods for restaurants.

For restaurants near UMSL, walk west on Natural Bridge Rd toward North Hanley Rd—Spiro's Greek Restaurant, Breakaway Café, and Para-Dice Grill are nearby.

## Safety

UMSL has the safest university campus in St. Louis; however, be careful at night. When it is dark, it is best to walk in groups. If you do not feel comfortable walking somewhere on campus, contact the UMSL Police Department at **314-516-5155** for an escort. They will come walk or drive with you. Also take caution at night in the area around UMSL and in St. Louis city. Some neighborhoods are more dangerous than others. Be aware of your surroundings, walk in groups, and ask UMSL staff or students if the place you're going is safe.

# Checklist

Complete these tasks during your first weeks at UMSL. Note the deadlines and learn more at orientation. For details on each step, visit [www.umsl.edu/international](http://www.umsl.edu/international) → Admitted Students.

- ☐ **Attend orientation in the Millennium Student Center** – Monday, August 12 through Wednesday, August 14
- ☐ **Get your MetroLink pass and/or parking pass** – during orientation
- ☐ **Get your student ID card** – during orientation
- ☐ **Look up your SSO ID & password** – by Tuesday, August 13
- ☐ **Set up your student email account** – by Tuesday, August 13
- ☐ **Register for classes with your academic advisor** – on Thursday, August 15 (appointment automatically made for you by ISS)
- ☐ **Buy your textbooks** – after you register for classes on August 15
- ☐ **Take the math placement test** – August 10, 13, or 19 (only if you want to take math this semester or if your advisor recommends it)
- ☐ **Set up emergency notification system** – recommended first week
- ☐ **Attend your first day of class** – Monday, August 19
- ☐ **Pay your tuition at the Cashiers Office** – first monthly payment due September 1 (to avoid extra charges, pay the full amount)
- ☐ **Pay your health insurance bill** – by Friday, August 30
- ☐ **Enroll your dependents in health insurance** – by Friday, August 30 (only if your spouse/child is in the US)
- ☐ **Submit missing admissions documents to ISS** – as soon as possible (only if you were admitted *provisionally*)
- ☐ **Complete your health record** – as soon as possible
- ☐ **Begin transfer credit process** – as soon as possible (process can take two months)
- ☐ **Create Aetna student health account** – anytime
- ☐ **Get a social security number** – after you get an on-campus job
- ☐ **Purchase a meal plan** – anytime, if you choose to
- ☐ **Give access to your family or others to see your student records or pay your student bill** – anytime, if you choose to
