Master of Music Education (MME)

Degree Program

Requires completion of 32 hours of graduate credit, 22 of which must be earned in residence. The degree is designed to enable music specialists in grades K-12 to pursue continued professional growth in a specialization of their choice: choral, general music, instrumental, or music technology. Students take primarily music education courses, but one three-hour course in Education is also required. A written examination that includes applications of music history and music theory/ear-training is taken during the first term of enrollment in the program to help advisors plan individual programs of study for students.

Application Requirements

1. Application

2. Three letters of recommendation

Letters that address academic potential must be provided by individuals who can accurately assess it, such as previous professors.

3. Official transcripts from all universities attended

Applicants must have a bachelor of music in music education (or equivalent) degree before beginning the master's program.

4. Entrance examinations

International students are required to document English proficiency by providing scores from an internationally accepted standardized examination before a decision is made on admission.

5. Grade Point Average

Minimum of 3.0 on 4.0 scale. Students whose GPA is between 2.75 and 2.9 may be admitted under some circumstances.

Application Deadline (for domestic students)

Fall admission: July 1

Winter/spring admission: December 1

Applications are processed as they are submitted. However, applications that are not received by the posted date may delay admission until the following semester.
