DEGREE PROGRAM

A minimum of 30 credit hours is required, including 24 hours in gerontology courses, and six credit hours in statistics and research methods. Students receive their Graduate Certificate in Gerontology upon completion of the first 18 hours of the MS program.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. Application

2. Three Letters of Recommendation
Letters that address academic potential must be provided by individuals who can accurately assess it such as previous instructors, professors, etc.
3. Official transcripts from all universities attended
Applicants must have completed a baccalaureate degree before beginning the master's program.
4. Entrance examinations
 - a) The Graduate Record Examination General Test is not required.
 - b) International students are required to document English proficiency (<http://www.umsl.edu/divisions/graduate/prospective/international.html>).
5. Grade Point Average
Minimum of 3.0 on 4.0 scale. Students whose overall GPA is 2.75 to 2.99 may be admitted under some circumstances.

APPLICATION DEADLINES (for domestic students)

Fall admission: July 1

Winter/spring admission: December 1

Applications are processed as they are submitted. However, those not received by the posted date may delay admission until the following semester.
