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FLEX RN to BSN Program

The Nursing Program at the College is fully accredited by the Commission for Collegiate Nursing Education, the nationally recognized accrediting body for baccalaureate and higher degree programs, and fully approved by the Missouri State Board of Nursing.

The policies of the University of Missouri-St. Louis comply with the provisions under those laws which forbid discrimination on the basis of race, color, sex, national origin, religion, age, handicap or veteran status in any program or activity of the university.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree requires 120 credit hours. RN/BSN students are required to complete 31 credit hours of nursing courses, including nursing statistics, and 51 general education requirements. Students are awarded 39 credit hours for their associate or diploma nursing courses. The University of Missouri-St. Louis requires that 24 of the last 30 credit hours be taken in residency.

RN/BSN students may transfer general education credit hours from community colleges and other accredited colleges and universities.

FLEX OPTIONS

TELECOMMUNICATED: Students who choose the telecommunicated program attend classes one night a week at the designated health care facility.

ONLINE: Students who choose the online program enjoy the convenience of attending classes via the Internet. Nursing course materials, lectures, assignments, etc. are available anytime.

ON CAMPUS: Students who choose the on campus program attend classes on the University's campus one night a week.

SATELITE SITES: Students who choose one of the satellite sites attend class at the specified site one night each week.

Admission Criteria

- ⇒ Admission to the University
- ⇒ Graduation from a State Board approved associate degree or diploma nursing program
- ⇒ Evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse with eligibility for licensure in Missouri
- ⇒ Completion of a minimum of 30 academic (non-nursing) credit hours with a cumulative 2.5 grade point average (GPA) on a 4.0 scale
