Students transferring to UM-St. Louls are expected to take most of thelr specific business work during their junior and senlor years. Business courses which are offered at the freshman or sophomore level and which are transferred in lieu of those offered at UM-St. Louis at the 200 level or above must be validated. Validation is determined by the appropriate disclpline and may Include:
