

## Faculty Positions in Computer Science at the University of Missouri-St. Louis

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science at the University of Missouri-St. Louis (UMSL) invites applications for two full-time, tenure-track faculty positions at the rank of Assistant Professor in Computer Science beginning Fall 2019. Qualified candidates are expected to have a Ph.D. in Computer Science or closely related discipline by the time of the appointment. Salary is competitive and dependent upon qualifications.

We are looking for applicants with potential and proven ability to conduct outstanding research, and with strong commitment to teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. One position is limited to candidates with expertise in Cybersecurity. For the other position, qualified candidates in all areas of Computer Science will be considered, with preference given to candidates with overlapping research interests of current faculty.

At the present time, the department (<http://www.cs.umsl.edu>) has about 30 full-time faculty members and about 10 graduate teaching assistants. The department offers Bachelor's and Master's degrees both in Mathematics and in Computer Science, and Ph.D. in Mathematical and Computational Sciences.

Candidates must submit a letter of application, statements of research and teaching philosophy, and current vita – all as a single pdf file through the university submission system at <https://www.umsl.edu/services/hrs/careers/index.html>, under Careers at UMSL | Faculty, then Prospective Faculty, job number 28455. Additionally, three letters of reference which address research and teaching (if any) must be submitted to [cssearch@umsl.edu](mailto:cssearch@umsl.edu). Additional questions may also be directed to the same email address.

The successful candidate must be able to show acceptable documentation establishing the right to accept employment in the US.
