- Bring your UMSL Student ID# (8 digit number)
- Confirmation Mailer publication to use for navigating campus
- Disability documentation if seeking accommodations

- You must bring a form of photo ID (valid driver's license, state ID, passport) with you to obtain your Triton One Card
- Casual clothing for 90° to 100° weather
- Comfortable shoes
- Sweater (for air-conditioned rooms)
- Pen for taking notes during the day
- Cash, check or credit card for souvenirs, textbooks, and a snack during the day

MY.VIEW AND MYGATEWAY

MYView is a self-service system in which students enables user to access campus finances, academic records, personal information and enrollment. .

MyGateway is self-service site that consolidates many of the resources available to students, faculty, and staff. The site features single sign on, so you can use your UMSL SSO ID and password to sign-in once and access all of these services.

From this portal, you'll be able to:

- Check grades, class schedule
- Check your e-mail
- Participate in blackboard classes
- Writing Lab and NetTutors
- Participate in LiveText classes
- View the campus calendar and job listings
- Link to DARS (Degree Audit Reporting System)

During Orientation, students will learn to navigate through these two portals in a computer lab presented by current leaders.

UMSL E-Mail Account

As part of your admission to UMSL, you are given an e-mail account for you use. All official University communication is directed through the RU e-mail account. It is very important that you check this account regularly for important information regarding registration, University events and emergency notification.

You can access your account through the MyGateway portal or directly at the UMSL Homepage at www.umsl.edu However, before you can access your account for the first time, you will need to change your password form.

RELEASE OF EDUCATION RECORDS AND FERPA

The Family Educational Rights Act (FERPA) of 1974, commonly known as FERPA, is a federal law that protects the privacy of student records. This includes personal information, grades, enrollment and financial records, and schedules. Students have specific, protected rights regarding the release of such records and FERPA requires that institutions adhere strictly to these guidelines.

For those students who wish to share their protected information, To facilitate the sharing of information, UMSL offers an easy method for students to grant permission to others (including parents) and, for those granted permission, the ability to access education records and financial information, through the Release of Education Records feature in the Student Center link in MyView.

During your NSO session, FERPA and the Release of Education Records feature will be introduced. To ensure and allow others to have access or preview your records including financial statements, we encourage students and families to discuss and complete this Release of Education Records before their arrival to their NSO session. SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES AT UMSL

Registering Procedures:

- * Complete the DAS application and registration form and schedule a meeting with the office
- * Provide appropriate documentation of your disability

Services available through DAS include:

- ◆ Pre-admission counseling
- ◆ Specialized testing accommodations (extended time, quiet environment, etc.)
- ◆ In-class accommodations
- ◆ Alternate textbook resources
- ◆ Assistance in locating and training volunteer note-takers
- ◆ Assistance in hiring readers for blind students
- ◆ Certified interpreters for deaf students
- ◆ Special furniture accommodations
- ◆ Emergency location procedures for mobility-impaired students
- ◆ Computers equipped with adaptive software
- ◆ Coordination with community resources including Vocational Rehabilitation, Rehabilitation Services for the Blind, and Paraquad

TUITION AND FEES

During your NSO session, you will finalize your course registration and class schedule, and attend a *Money Matters* session. During this session, the Cashier's Office will highlight the responsibilities and general payment information for your tuition and fees, discuss the process on how to pay and set up an Authorized Payer, and navigate through the Myview portal to preview a summary of the financial charges. The charges will represent the cost of the hours in which you have enrolled, room and board, and additional services (ie. Financial aid, scholarships, and any additional fees). The Money Matters session will provide information and a time to ask questions to allow for a sense of ease and understanding about the fiscal responsibility for a college experience. IF YOU DO NOT KNOW YOUR ACCOUNT PASSWORD: Please go to <http://myview.umsl.edu> and click the "Forgot My Password" link. You will need to follow the instructions carefully to create a new password using this process. Be mindful of the password requirements. When you have created your account password, **WRITE IT DOWN.**
