Types of Programs

1. **Faculty-Led Programs:** UMSL professors take groups of students and community members to a foreign location. The professors create the schedules, organize excursions and lectures, and assign grades.
2. **Other UMSL Programs:** UMSL has partner universities in different countries which organize summer programs, most taught in English, for students from around the world. This is an opportunity to pay UMSL tuition and earn UMSL credit while interacting with other students from the US and from many other countries.
3. **Non-UMSL Programs:** You may attend most accredited summer programs organized by other universities. Contact the Study Abroad Office for program approval. Whether you choose to participate in a UM-St. Louis program or another approved program, you must apply through the Study Abroad Office before the deadline.

Cost

The cost varies for each program. Pay close attention to what is included in the fee: some include meals, airfare, or excursions, others do not. Keep in mind the program length, number of credits, and the additional cost of airfare, meals, insurance, and personal expenses, to accurately compare programs. Many costs listed in this brochure are estimates, the final price will depend on exchange rates and educational fees increases for Summer 2009.

UMSL reserves the right to revise the program fee if there are fluctuations in the exchange rate.

Scholarships

The Center for International Studies (CIS) awards scholarships to study abroad participants based on merit. A minimum 2.75 GPA is required. For summer programs, scholarships may range from \$250 - \$1,000. There are additional scholarship monies available for some UMSL faculty-led programs. There is one application form for all these scholarships. **The deadline to apply for CIS scholarships is February 23, 2009.**

Financial Aid

The financial aid package you are awarded each year must be distributed over the fall, winter, and summer terms. If you need aid for a summer program in addition to the financial aid you already receive, there are state and private loans that you may apply for. **You must take a minimum of five credits to be eligible for summer aid.** Make an appointment with Carol Banks in the Financial Aid Office, 327 MSC (516-6394) for more information.

Earning Credit

For all programs, with the exception of some faculty-led programs, you must earn academic credit to participate. The majority of programs will have a pre-approved UMSL course number for which you will earn credit. To earn language credit, you must bring the course description and meet with the appropriate advisor to have the course evaluated.

Each summer, UM-St. Louis faculty lead a variety of programs around the world. This can be an affordable opportunity to earn UMSL credit abroad. Each faculty-led program will be assigned UMSL course numbers.

Irish Studies in Galway

6 credits

June 23-July 23 in Galway, Ireland

Faculty Coordinator: Eamonn Wall

Choose two courses from six possibilities including Irish archeology, history, Gaelic culture and literature, Irish society, literature and film and Irish music. Enjoy field trips and cultural events while you sample living in western Ireland's most vibrant city.

Program Fee: \$4,325 includes housing in apartments, 6 credits tuition (transfer credit), field trips, and health insurance. *A \$100 non-refundable deposit is due with application. \$1000 scholarships available to qualified UMSL students.*

China Study Tour

3 credits (Bus Ad 3689)

May 24-June 9 in various Chinese cities

Faculty Leader: Hung-gay Fung

Experience a fascinating blend of traditional and modern - cultural exploration combined with a study of a diverse economy. Learn about and visit businesses in Beijing, Nanjing, and Shanghai, and tour the famous Great Wall, Forbidden City and other landmarks of the ancient country. The trip includes lectures, language study, company and government visits, daily cultural experiences, in-country travel and breathtaking trips to major sites of interest. Airfare not included.

Program Fee: \$1,800 includes lodging, all meals, in-country transportation, breakfasts, entrance fees, lectures, textbooks, visa, and health insurance.

Tuition: \$773.80

A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application by Feb 6. Remainder of fees (\$1,300) are due March 6.

Strasbourg French Language Program

6 credits (French 2190 and French 3271)

July 5-25 in Strasbourg, France

Faculty Leaders: Beth Landers and Sandy Trapani

Experience the rich cultural heritage and picturesque setting of this dynamic European capital. The program will include language study, tours of major sites of interest, an excursion on the Alsatian Wine Route, and more. Students must have taken French 2101.

Program fee: \$1450 includes housing, in-country transportation, class materials, admission to cultural venues, some meals, and insurance.

Tuition: \$1,546.80 *A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application by Feb 6. Remainder of program fee (\$950) is due March 20.*

Iklaina Archaeological Project

6 credits (Anthro 3290 and 2109 or 4309)

May 25-June 12 OR June 12-July 1 in Pylos, Greece

Faculty Leader: Michael Cosmopoulos

Participate in archaeological fieldwork, travel to major archaeological sites and museums and attend lectures on Greek history, literature, philosophy, archeology, art and culture.

Program Fee: \$2,790 includes housing, in-country transportation, breakfast and dinner daily, admissions to venues, lectures, and health insurance.

Tuition: \$1,546.80

A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application.

Balance of fees (\$2290) due May 1.

\$1000 scholarships available to qualified UMSL students.

Criminal Justice Studies in Germany

6 credits (3 credits CCJ 3290 and 3306)

July 17-Aug 2 in various German cities

Faculty Leader: Finn Esbensen

This summer study tour is designed as an introduction to German culture, using the justice system as a focal point. This will be a joint seminar with UMSL and German students. Topics include restorative justice, youth violence, and the role of comparative criminology in contemporary criminology. Several field trips to cultural and historical sites included.

Program Fee: TBA

Tuition: \$1,546.80

A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application.

Study Spanish in Barcelona, Spain

3 credits (Span 2101, 2171, or 3271)

May 17-30 in Barcelona, Spain

Faculty Leader: Deborah Baldini

Experience the rich cultural heritage and picturesque setting of this Mediterranean city. Includes Spanish language study, tours of major sites of interest, and more. Students must have taken Spanish 1002.

Program Fee: \$1700 includes instruction, course materials, accommodation, breakfast, transit card, insurance, tours, and museum entrances.

Tuition: \$773.40

A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application.

Balance of fees (\$1,200) due March 20.

Summer Program in South Africa

6 credits

June 13-July 10 in Capetown, South Africa

Faculty Leaders: Sheilah Clarke-Ekong, Richard White

The trip includes a 2-night stay in Kruger National Park, where students will learn about the ecology and environment of South Africa while witnessing the diverse wildlife and impressive historical and archaeological sights of the region. Classes will also cover contemporary perspectives on women in Sub-Saharan Africa.

Program Fee ESTIMATE: \$5000 includes airfare, lodging, most meals, field trips, textbooks, and insurance.

A \$500 non-refundable deposit is due with application.

International Business & Politics

Angers Summer Program: European Business and Political Integration 6 credits (Pol Sci 2510 and Bus Ad 3198)

June 16 - July 17 in Angers & Paris, France and Brussels, Belgium

The Angers Summer Program, taught in English by ESSCA university in France, offers a thorough understanding of how the EU functions. Explore European business and its interactions with the US and other regions of the globe. Students spend approx. 3 weeks in Angers, a week in Brussels, and a week in Paris.

Program Fee: 2,200 Euros (tentative) includes lodging, breakfast, excursions, & inter-city transportation.

Tuition: \$1,546.80

European Integration and Business in the Capital of Europe

6 credits

5 weeks in June in Strasbourg, France

Students will take courses in European Integration and Business in Europe, taught entirely in English. Company visits and French language courses will complete the European integration experience.

Program Fee: 2,000 Euros (tentative) includes hotel stay, breakfasts, company visits, and trip to Frankfurt.

Tuition: \$1,546.80

International Summer University at Vienna U. of Economics & Business Administration 4 credits

July 6-24 OR July 27-Aug 14 in Vienna, Austria

Vienna University offers a variety of business classes taught in English. Study with students from around the world for a truly international experience. A great chance to study business at a world-class university in a beautiful city.

Program Fee: 1,090 Euros (tentative) includes accommodation, breakfasts and lunches, public transportation, and course materials.

Tuition: \$1,031.20

General Interest

Missouri London Program (MLP) 3-9 credits

Session 1: May 17 – June 9

Session 2: June 9 – July 3

Session 3: July 3 – July 28

Session 1 + Internship: May 17 – August 9

Located in central London, students take classes or participate in an internship. Internships are unpaid and available in many fields. Take one 3-credit course per session, and attend one, two, or all three sessions.

Housing is in shared flats with American students.
Program Fee: \$4,395 (1 session) - \$7,995 (3 sessions) includes airfare from Chicago, housing, and activities.
Tuition: \$773.80 per 3 credits.

Field Schools in Peru 6 transfer credits

June 30-July 31 Various locations in Peru

These field schools, organized by Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú (PUCP), are offered in various subjects (anthropology, archaeology, music, etc.) and taught in English. Students should have at least a basic knowledge of Spanish to interact with locals. See website for requirements for each field school.

-Ethnography Project: Andean Ethnomusicology

Program Fee: \$3,650 includes in-country transport, accommodation and meals, 6 transfer credits from PUCP, excursions, and PUCP administrative fee.

Korea University Summer Campus 6 credits

June 30-August 8 (tentative) in Seoul, Korea

Korea University is located on a beautiful, green campus in Seoul. Choose from a variety of courses (taught in English) including: Korean Language and Studies, Business, Political Science, Sociology, and Humanities. Students may participate in a one-month business internship prior to the start of the summer program.

Housing is in the new international student dormitory.

Program Fee: \$1,200 includes housing, airport pickup, and some excursions.

Tuition: \$1,546.80

Nuestra America: (Re-)approaching the Americas, 3 credits

July 12-July 26 at Seggau Castle in Leibnitz, Austria

This program will explore identity and interaction issues between the countries of North and South America, using an interdisciplinary analysis for a redefinition of the Americas in a globalized world. Taught in English.

Program Fee: 600 Euros includes study materials, excursions, housing, and two meals daily.

Tuition: \$773.40

Democracy and its Discontents 3 credits (Pol Sc 3900)

July 6-18 in Antwerp, Belgium

This program will focus on the theme of democracy, inclusion, and active citizenship. Lectures will be multidisciplinary and taught in English.

Program Fee: 600 Euros includes course materials, excursions, housing, and two meals daily.

Tuition: \$773.80

Foreign Language

CIDEF Intensive French Language Institute 6 transfer credits

July 1-30 in Angers, France

One-month intensive French language program. Optional weekend excursions to historic and cultural sites in the region. Live in the dormitory or rent a room from a French family. Cost varies depending on housing choice, meal plan, and excursions. **Intermediate level students should first consider the Strasbourg French program** (see page 2).

Housing: 725 - 1,150 Euros (depending on meal plan)

Optional Excursions: 300 Euros

Tuition: 890 Euros

Korea University Summer Campus 6 credits

June 30—August 8 in Seoul, Korea

Spanish Language/Latin American Culture 3 or 6 credits

May 26-July 8 in Monterrey (other Mexican cities possible, discuss with study abroad coordinator) Course offerings vary depending on campus and length of study. Spanish language classes are offered at all levels, as well as culture and business courses taught in English. Housing with host families (includes meals) or in dormitory.

Housing Fee: \$820-\$900

Tuition: \$773.40 (3 credits) or \$1,546.80 (6 credits)

Stuttgart Summer University 6 credits

May 18-June 26 (tentative) in Stuttgart, Germany A 3-credit German language class is taught at beginner and intermediate levels. In addition, you'll choose a 3-credit elective class (taught in English) from the following: 20th Century Architecture, European Art and Architecture from the Middle Ages to the Present, Cross-Cultural Communication, Transportation and Urban Planning, or Deutschland nach der Wende (in German). Program Fee: 850 Euros includes housing and mandatory excursions.

Tuition: \$1,546.80

German Language, Business, and Law 3 or 6 credits

July 5-July 30 in Bremen, Germany

Students can choose from German language classes offered at beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels, or business or law courses taught in English or German. Housing is in shared flats near the university. Week-end excursions are available for 35 Euros each.

Housing Fee: 300-350 Euros

Tuition: \$773.40 (3 credits) or \$1,546.80 (6 credits)

Intensive Arabic Language Program 6 credits (Arabic 2101 and 2190)

May 19-June 29 (tentative) in Zarqa, Jordan

The Summer Arabic program at Hashemite University near Amman, Jordan, provides intensive Arabic language instruction at the intermediate or advanced level, field trips, and orientation on the country and culture of Jordan. Participants must have completed Arabic 1002. Program Fee: \$3400 (tentative) includes tuition, in-country transportation, housing, field trips, escorts, and some meals. Does not include airfare.
