Heavy Grading. We have extensive experience moving millions of yards of material. With our quarry expertise, we can complete large-rock excavation jobs that require drilling and blasting. We can also handle on-site excavated material with scrapers, side-dumps and end-dumps or off-site excavated materials in side-dump trailers.

Bridge Building. We can self-perform 100 percent of your project, completing all phases of work:

- Initial Excavation
- Pile Driving
- Substructure Work
- Finished Superstructure
- Aesthetic Enhancement

Asphalt Paving. We can handle the complete job – from producing the asphalt material to laying final product and testing the smoothness. During a normal construction season,

- We remove nearly 1 million square yards of material using a roto-milling (pavement-planing) operation, which can run two crews concurrently.



We produce Super Pave asphalt for those projects that have to meet MODOT stringent specifications.
