



## **Français 1002**

### **Présentation orale**

Date: jeudi, le premier mai, 2008

Type of exam: an oral presentation in front of your classmates on the topic listed below. The presentation has to be well organized and coherent, with an introduction and a conclusion. Keep in mind these basic presentation skills:

- Eye contact with the audience (not just the instructor)
- Clear and loud voice
- Interesting and creative delivery and content
- Effective use of images. They should enhance your presentation.

Topic: *Talk about a trip real or imagined including the following information:*

- tell what cities, states, or countries you visited on that trip*
- tell why you chose to visit those places*
- tell when you went*
- tell how much time you spent in each place*
- tell with whom you traveled*
- talk about the different forms of transportation you used during the trip*
- give a brief description of the places, people, the weather, etc.*
- talk about several of the activities that you did during your trip*
- talk about the restaurants you visited and the types of food that you had*
- don't forget a conclusion- tell whether you enjoyed your trip and if it was the best trip you've ever taken*

Format: PowerPoint with viewable images, absolutely no text other than headers will be allowed. Headers are not required, but no other text may appear in the PowerPoint document and no note cards or any other written information may be used.

Number of images: no fewer than 6 and no more than 12. You may use personal photos, images from the internet, or Clip Art.

Duration: 4 minutes minimum and 6 minutes maximum.

Grading criteria:

The presentation will be recorded and your grade will be based on the following:

- 0-5 Presentation Skills / Use of visuals / Engaging
- 0-5 Grammar – evidence of acquisition of structures studied
- 0-5 Vocabulary – varied and accurate
- 0-5 Clarity of speech / Fluency / Pronunciation
- 0-5 Content – organization, variety of topics/headers, creative / Engaging

While you present, your classmates will listen and complete a chart like the one below for each presentation. Every student must provide information in French on each presentation and will be required to ask questions in French of the presenter if they were unable to get the required information out of each presentation.
