Black's Law Dictionary. Henry Campbell Black. 8th ed. St. Paul: West Publishing Company, 2004.

REF DESK KF 156 .B53 2004

Standard dictionary giving definitions of the terms and phrases of American and English jurisprudence, both historical and modern.

Crime Dictionary. Ralph De Sola. Rev. and expanded ed. N.Y.: Facts on File, 1988.

REF HV 6025 .D43 1988

Covers abbreviations, criminal slang, criminal syndicate terminology, alcohol and narcotics terminology, medical and psychiatric expressions, nicknames, terrorist groups and many other subjects.

Dictionary of American Penology. Vergil L. Williams. Rev. and expanded ed. Westport, CT: Greenwood Press, 1996.

The lengthy articles in this encyclopedic dictionary describe such diverse topics as accreditation of correctional facilities to work release programs. Includes Appendices covering Prison Reform Organizations, addresses for prison systems, and selected statistics from the U.S. Justice Department, Bureau of Justice Statistics.

Domestic Violence and Child Abuse Sourcebook. Helene Henderson, Ed. Detroit: Omnigraphics, Inc., 2000.

Consumer health information covering all forms of domestic violence and child abuse. Includes a glossary, list of additional readings, and government and non-governmental agencies and organizations.

Encyclopedia of American Prisons. Marilyn D. McShane and Frank P. Williams, III, eds. N.Y.: Garland Publishing, Inc., 1996.

HV 9471 .E425 1996 (level 4)

Signed articles from experts and professionals provide insight into "the story of the people, places and ideas behind the American prison system." Each entry concludes with a bibliography.

Encyclopedia of Capital Punishment. Louis J. Palmer, Jr. Jefferson, NC: McFarland & Company, Inc., 2001. 4 vols.

Provides a comprehensive source of information on the legal, social, and political history and present status of capital punishment in the United States. Includes Supreme Court opinions, summaries of capital punishment laws in various U. S. jurisdictions, as well as the status of capital punishment in nations around the world. Statistical data and the impact of capital punishment on specific segments of the population are also included.

Encyclopedia of Crime and Justice. Joshua Dressler. 2nd ed. Macmillan USA, 2002. 4 vols.

An interdisciplinary approach to describing the nature and causes of criminal behavior, the prevention of crime, the punishment and treatment of offenders, the functioning of the criminal justice institutions, and the bodies of law defining criminal behavior, and the governing processes through which criminal law is applied. Arranged by broad topical categories, with general and legal indexed and a glossary.

Encyclopedia of Criminology and Deviant Behavior. Clifton D. Bryant, Ed. Philadelphia, PA : Brunner-Routledge, 2001. 4 vols.

This set is not an alphabetical arrangement by topic; each of the four volumes focuses on a different central theme: V. 1 - Historical, Conceptual, and Theoretical Issues, V. 2 – Crime and Delinquency, V. 3 – Sexual Deviance and V. 4 – Self-Destructive Behavior and Devalued Identity. Each authored entry includes a bibliography of additional source materials.

Encyclopedia of Drugs, Alcohol and Addictive Behavior. Rosalyn Carson-DeWitt. 2nd ed. N.Y.: Macmillan Reference, USA, 2001. 4 vols.

Articles cover a variety of drug and alcohol related topics, including the effects on the body, social policy, history, politics, economics, international trafficking, governmental agencies, treatment, etc.

Encyclopedia of Organized Crime in the United States. Robert J. Kelly. Westport, Conn.: Greenwood Press, 2000.

This book covers organized, businesslike, “professional” crime.

Encyclopedia of Police Science. William G. Bailey, ed. N.Y.: Garland Publishing, Inc., 1995.

The signed articles in this publication focus on the many issues in police science. Includes some biographical material, as well as more general topics.

Encyclopedia of Terrorism. Harvey W. Kushner. Thousand Oaks, CA: Sage Publications, 2003.

“(A) single-volume encyclopedia, with over 300 entries, on the subject of terrorism worldwide. Appendixes include a chronology of terrorism from 1865 to the present, a list of web resources, an extensive bibliography, and maps noting the locations of terrorist activities around the world....”

Encyclopedia of the American Judicial System: Studies of the Principal Institutions and Processes of Law. Robert J. Janosik. N.Y.: Scribner, 1987. 3 vols.

A collection of signed articles dealing with legal history, substantive law, institutions and personnel, constitutional law and issues, and methodology.

The FBI: A Comprehensive Reference Guide. Athan G. Theoharis, ed. Phoenix, Ariz.: Oryx Press, 1999.

REF HV 8144 .F43 T48 1999

This book surveys the history of the bureau, its important personalities and cases, and controversies surrounding the bureau.

Gambling in America : an encyclopedia of history, issues, and society. William N. Thompson. Santa Barbara : ABC-CLIO, 2001.

REF GV 1302. T47 2001

The focus of this publication is on gambling in the western hemisphere, but also includes items about other countries when the information helps to clarify or provide a comparative base. Includes a chronology, glossary, list of major cases, and an eclectic group of ‘articles’ about gambling.

Hate Crimes: a Reference Handbook. Donald Altschiller. Santa Barbara, CA: ABC-CLIO, 2005.

Includes a history of hate crime legislation, descriptions of some of the major targeted groups, biographical sketches, statistics, print and non-print resources, etc.

The Mafia Encyclopedia. Carl Sifakis. NY: Facts on File, 2nd ed., 1999.

This book covers the Mafia as an integral part of organized crime since the 1920's. Biographies of Mafia figures are included.

Suggestions of where and how to look for information when conducting research on criminal justice issues, ranging from using standard library resources to the world wide web.

Criminal Justice Research in Libraries and on the Internet. Bonnie R. Nelson. Westport, CT: Greenwood Press, 1997.

This revised edition is similar to the above source. One of its unique features is a listing and description of major criminal justice Commission reports beginning with the 1931 Wickersham Commission discussing Prohibition, and going through to the 1993 Mollen Commission Report on police corruption in N. Y. City.

INDEXES

Criminal Justice Abstracts. Online. 1968- . Available on campus and remotely with a UM-St. Louis Gateway ID and password.

This service provides abstracts of books and journal articles in the criminal justice field, both nationally and internationally.

Criminal Justice Periodical Index. Ann Arbor, MI: University Microfilms, Indexing Services. V.1-, 1975- V. 24, 1998. Tercennial.

UMS TJ COM1 KF8 .C7x, 1(1975) – 24(1998). Level 1 compact shelving room.

Alternate title: *CJPI*. Indexes approximately 100 periodical titles by author and subject. The subject index includes the names of legal cases. Issues cumulate annually.

Academic OneFile. Online. 1965 - . Available on campus and remotely with a UM-St. Louis Gateway ID and password.

This is a general database with broad coverage on many subjects and it contains many full text articles.

Academic Search Premier. Online. 1965 - . Available on campus and remotely with a UM-St. Louis Gateway ID and password.

This is a general database with broad coverage on many subjects and it contains many full text articles.

GPO Access. Online. This resource is available through any Internet access point. <http://www.gpoaccess.gov/>

GPO Access is a government site that provides free access to over 1,000 databases of federal information.

GPO Monthly Catalog. Online. 1976 - . This database is only available within the libraries.

An index to all government documents cataloged by the Government Printing Office from June 1976 to the present. Includes over 380,000 records on all subjects of interest to the U.S. government. July 1976 to the present. Updated monthly.

Index to Legal Periodicals and Books. NY: H. W. Wilson. V.1- , 1926- . Monthly.

UMS TJ COM 1 K33 .I53 [Level 1 of TJ Library; also vols. for previous title *Index to Legal Periodicals*.]

A subject and author index to legal journals. Often the best source of information in many areas of the law.

NCJRS (National Criminal Justice Reference Service). Online. This resource is available through any Internet access point.

The National Criminal Justice Reference Service Abstracts Database contains summaries of more than 140,000 criminal justice publications, including Federal, State, and local government reports, books, research reports, journal articles, and unpublished research.

DIRECTORIES

National Directory of Law Enforcement Administrators® Correctional Institutions and Related Governmental Agencies. Milwaukee, Wis.: National Police Chiefs and Sheriffs Information Bureau, 1998.

REF HV8130 .N372

Comprehensive index listing municipal through international police agencies, coroners and medical examiners, prosecutors, child support services, and other groups involved in law enforcement.

National Jail and Adult Detention Directory. College Park, MD: American Correctional Association, 1996-98.

REF HV 9463 .N3x

Gives names, addresses and phone numbers of correctional facilities in alphabetical order by state. Tables give aggregated information on staff salaries, annual budgets, size of facility and population.

STATISTICS - GENERAL

Crime State Rankings: Crime in the 50 United States. Kathleen Morgan, et al. Lawrence, KS: Morgan Quinto Corporation, 1997.

REF HV 6787 .C7

This publication uses clearly and consistently arranged tables to provide statistics on arrests, offenses, corrections, law enforcement personnel and finance, courts, etc. Many tables give U.S. totals and state totals with % of national total.

STATISTICS - MISSOURI

Missouri Crime and Arrests Digest. Jefferson City: Missouri Dept. of Public Safety, Missouri State Highway Patrol, 1983-2000.

REF HV 6793 .M8 M57 (2000 edition in REF; older editions on Level 4 of Thomas Jefferson Library)

Based on statistics gathered by local sources and the FBI for the *Uniform Crime Report* (see below) with local analysis done by the Statistical Analysis Center of the Missouri State Highway Patrol. Explains the Missouri crime index and gives statistics for the major crime categories.

Missouri Crime Summary. Jefferson City: Missouri Dept. of Public Safety, Missouri State Highway Patrol, 1982- 2000.

REF LAW KFM 8362 .M54x (current ed. in REF LAW; older editions on Level 4 of TJL.)

Brief summary of crimes committed in Missouri, broken down by county, city, by offense and number of arrests.

Missouri Law Enforcement Employment and Assault Report. Jefferson City: Missouri Statistical Analysis Center, Missouri Dept. of Public Safety, 1982-2000.

REF HV 7571 .M8 M48x (current ed. in REF, older editions on Level 4 of TJL.)

Provides statistics related to law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty, officer assaults and law enforcement employment levels in Missouri.

State of Juvenile Justice. Issues and Priorities for Missouri's Juvenile Justice System, 1995-1998. Jefferson City: Missouri Dept. of Public Safety and Missouri Juvenile Justice Advisory Group, 1994.

REF HV 9105 .M8 S78 1994

Provides information on plans for spending of federal money received through the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act, as well as information and statistics on Missouri youth and families, trends in juvenile involvement in criminal activities, State agencies involved in youth crime prevention, and detention programs.

STATISTICS – FEDERAL DOCUMENTS

In addition to the statistical materials published by the Federal Government, there are many useful materials available in our Government Documents collection. The “J” and “Ju” call number ranges in the Superintendent of Documents (SUDOC) call number system encompass items published by the various justice and judicial departments of the government - i.e. the Dept. of Justice, the FBI, the Bureau of Justice Statistics, offices of the Attorney General, the various courts. These materials include reports, pamphlets, manual, and periodicals. For a discussion of government materials and how to access them in the Thomas Jefferson Library please see the handout *A Brief Guide to Government Documents*.

Sourcebook of Criminal Justice Statistics. Washington: U.S. Dept. of Justice. Bureau of Justice Statistics, 1975- Annual.

REF DESK SUDOC J 29.9/6: current year. Older editions in Documents Stacks, Level 3.

Convenient compilation of previously published statistics on criminal justice and related topics. These statistics are assembled from a variety of federal, state, and local government and private sources. Emphasizes most recent data available and provides comparative data for establishing trends. Topics covered include public attitudes toward crime, nature and distribution of known offenses, and distribution of persons arrested.

Statistical Abstract of the U.S. Washington: U.S. Dept. of Commerce, Bureau of the Census, 1878- . Annual.

REF DESK SUDOC C 3.134: current year. Older editions in Document Stacks, Level 3.

Standard summary of statistics on the social, political and economic organization of the U.S. Designed as a handy statistical reference and a guide to other statistical sources.

Uniform Crime Reports for the U.S. Washington: U.S. Dept. of Justice, FBI, 1940- . Annual.

REF DESK SUDOC J 1.14/7: current year. Older editions in Documents Stacks, Level 3.

Also known as *Crime in the U.S.*, this well-known and authoritative report compiles statistics on reported crime throughout the U.S. The most widely used section is the index of offenses, which is arranged by type of crime. Other topics covered include persons arrested, persons charged, law enforcement personnel and a summary of the Uniform Crime Reporting Program.

LAW - REFERENCE

This standard, comprehensive legal encyclopedia is arranged alphabetically by subject. The articles are annotated with citations to primary and secondary sources, legal journals and court reports. Tables of statutes and rules cited are included. An eight volume index provides access to the articles. Our subscription ceased with 1998.

Criminal Law Digest. James A Douglas. 3rd ed. Boston: Warren, Gorham & Lamont, 1983.

REF LAW KF 9219 .C7 1983 and suppl.

A topically classified digest of significant decisions on criminal law and procedure including those published in *Criminal Law Bulletin*, Vol. 1-18. Covers state, federal, constitutional law and procedure. An alphabetical case index at the end enables readers to locate cases when the name of the case is the only known information.

Annual Report. St. Louis: St. Louis Metropolitan Police Dept., 1958- . Annual.

REF HV 7609 .A4 (current ed. in REF, older ed. on Level 4 of TJL.)

Includes St. Louis crime and traffic statistics, personnel and annual budget figures.
