



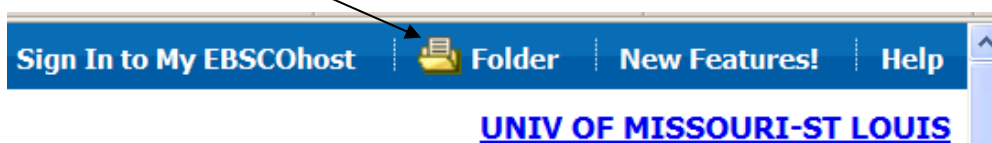
## Formatting Citations in EbscoHOST Databases

Citations in any **EbscoHOST** database can be easily formatted for **APA**, **MLA** and **Chicago Author-Date** style. **EbscoHOST** databases at the UMSL Libraries include *Academic Search Premier*, *America: History & Life* and *CINAHL*.

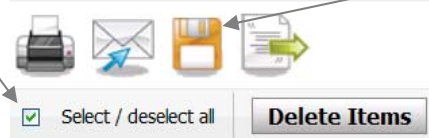
1) After performing a search, click  [Add to folder](#) under any citation you want to format:

2) After selecting citations, click the  icon at the very top-right of the search screen:



3) At the next screen click the box to **Select** your citations, and THEN click 



4) **UNCHECK** the box for **HTML Full Text** (otherwise all articles you select will be printed),

select your **Citation Format** (in this example, **MLA** has been selected) and then click the  button on the left.


5) **SCROLL DOWN** until you see the citations reformatted in the style that you chose. You can print the citations, or copy and paste them into your document. **REVIEW** the citations and make any necessary corrections (for example, they will **NOT** be in alphabetical order). You **MIGHT** also need to add information, such as Library Name (use: **University of Missouri-St. Louis Libraries**).

## Formatting Citations in ProQuest Databases

Citations in any **ProQuest** databases can be easily formatted for **APA**, **MLA** and **Chicago Author-Date** style. **ProQuest** databases at the UMSL Libraries include *ABI/Inform* and *Dissertations & Theses*.

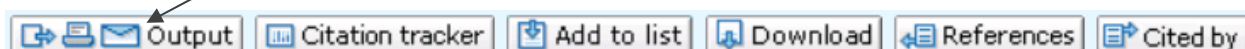
## Formatting Citations in SCOPUS

Citations in the **SCOPUS** database can be easily formatted for **APA**, **MLA**, **Chicago Author-Date** and other citation styles.

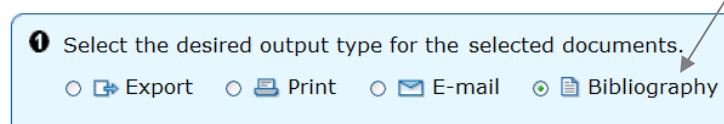
- 1) After performing a search, click the checkbox next to any citation you want to format:




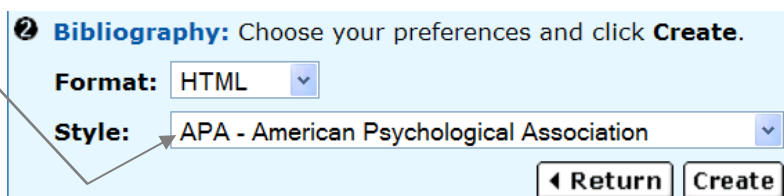
- 2) Click on the  **Output** button at the top or bottom of the search results screen:



- 3) At the next screen, click the option for:  **Bibliography**



- 4) Next, choose your citation preference and then click  **Create**  
 In the example below, **APA** citation style has been selected:



- 5) You will see your citations in a **NEW WINDOW** or **TAB**. You can print the citations, or copy and paste them into your document. **REVIEW** the citations and make any necessary corrections (for example, they might **NOT** be in alphabetical order). You **MIGHT** also need to add information, such as Library Name (use: **University of Missouri-St. Louis Libraries**).
