ABOUT THE GRANT

The Junior Faculty Travel Grant competition is open to full-time, untenured, tenure-track faculty members who will remain employed by the University for one full year following the end of the award period. The purpose of the funding is to strengthen faculty research and creative activities.

Up to \$1,000 will be awarded for expenses to attend a professional conference at which the applicant will be making a presentation (e.g., seminar, workshop, poster, panel member, discussant, key conference organizer). **The Panel will consider applications for conference travel between 1/1/19 and 12/31/19.**

Through a competitive process, awards will be made to junior faculty from any discipline. Faculty members may receive **only one Office of Research Administration funded Junior Faculty Travel Grant award** during an award cycle. A presentation need not be accepted by the conference organizers at the time of application for this travel award. If the presentation is not accepted or is withdrawn, awarded funds must be returned to the Office of Research Administration. Documentation of presentation will be required at the time of reimbursement.

It is assumed that, in most cases, faculty members will be able to apply for funds prior to the conference travel. Future travel will be given priority in this review, as will applications from investigators who were not funded by this mechanism last year. Applications for retroactive travel support (i.e., back to 8/1/18) will be considered on a case-by-case basis. As this is a competitive process, it is the responsibility of the applicant to provide a strong justification for funding support.
