College of Business Administration Professor Receives Distinguished Service Award

The ORA would like to extend Congratulations to Professor **Vicki Sauter**, recipient of the George E. Kimball Medal in recognition of distinguished service to The Institute for Operations Research and the Management Sciences and the profession of operations research and the management science. Vicki received the award at the annual INFORMS meeting in Atlanta, on October 20, 2003.

CORTEX Receives \$12 million in State Tax Credit

Missouri Development Finance Board granted \$12 million of state tax credits to the Center of Research, Technology and Entrepreneurial Expertise (CORTEX). CORTEX is a consortium of UM-St. Louis, Washington University, St. Louis University, and BJC Healthcare. UM-St. Louis's share of equity ownership in CORTEX is 14%.

This is a significant event for CORTEX. These 50-cents per dollar credits will be available to support \$24 million of property acquisitions. Many people in CORTEX consortium worked tirelessly over the past year to achieve this grant. In addition, special recognition goes to Governor Bob Holden, Lieutenant Governor Joe Maxwell, Mayor Francis Slay, Deputy Mayor Barbara Geisman, Bill Danforth, John Dubinsky, Harvey Harris, and Donn Rubin.

The ORA has forwarded 15 proposal to the UM Research Board office. The total amount requested is \$436,832. The UM Research Board is scheduled to meet on December 5, 2003.

President's Awards

Nominations for the Entrepreneur of the Year Award are due at the Office of Research on **December 15, 2003**. This is a System-wide award, and UM – St. Louis may forward up to two nominations. The deadline at the System level is **December 31, 2003**. The award recognizes a faculty whose discovery promises to make significant contributions to commercialization efforts. More specifically, the purpose of the award is: "to honor a University of Missouri faculty member for a record of entrepreneurial innovation that demonstrates commercial utility, contributes to the public welfare, and brings visibility to the University of Missouri. Examples may include the receipt of a patent that represents an important scientific breakthrough, a significant contribution to the public good, or significant economic value; involvement in the launch of a start-up company; significant contributions to student entrepreneurship; and others." PeopleSoft Tip-of-the-Month

Confusion over DEPTID?

Finding and using the correct DEPTID continues to cause problems and delays in submitting proposals. There are different Department ID codes used in the PeopleSoft Grants Module—at different times, you are asked to identify both the department account that will receive any grant funds and the department account that will provide any matching funds you include in your proposal. Here are some quick pointers for finding the right code for the right circumstance:

- 1) In the **“Project”** panel, you identify the account that will handle your grant.
 - In the box labeled **“Dept,”** type an upper-case S. This will limit the selections to only UM-St. Louis accounts.

- In the box labeled “**Description**,” type “GRANTS,” add a space, then type in the first letter of the school, department, or division. For example, to find the appropriate grant account in Biology, you would type “GRANTS B.” If you have trouble finding your department, please call ORA.
 - But what if there are several grant DEPTIDs? Following the name of the account, there will be a number; that number will help you identify the type of account. Select the one that reflects the type of program the grant will support.

- 2) In the “**Cost Sharing**” panel, you identify the department account that will provide the cost sharing. Type an upper-case S in the “**Dept**” box. In the “**Description**” box, you would type the first letter or two of the department. If you do not know which account will supply the matching dollars, consult with your department or division fiscal officer to determine what is appropriate.

In the “**Budget Line Summary**” section, you select the same DEPTID you choose for the “**Cost Sharing**” panel.

If you have any questions or problems locating the correct DEPT ID for your proposal, we encourage you to call the ORA at 516-5897 to avoid delays in submitting.

Funding News

Six New Funding Opportunities from National Science Foundation Chemical Bonding Centers (CBC), Phase I NSF 03-606

The CBC Program is designed to support the formation of centers that can address major, long-term basic chemical research problems. Appropriate research problems are high-risk but potentially high-impact because they will attract broad scientific and public interest. Centers are expected to be agile structures that can respond rapidly to emerging opportunities and make full use of cyber infrastructure to enhance collaborations. Center teams may include researchers from other disciplines and from academia, industry, government laboratories and international organizations. Centers will be selected through a multi-phase peer-review process. Phase I consists of a preliminary proposal that will be peer reviewed, followed by an invited full proposal to explore development of a center. Success at both steps of Phase I is an eligibility criterion for participation in Phase II. Phase II consists of proposals seeking full-scale implementation of a CBC in FY 2007.

Discovery Corps Fellowships NSF 03-596

The Discovery Corps Fellowship Program is a pilot program seeking new postdoctoral and professional development models that combine research expertise with professional service. Discovery Corps Fellows leverage their research expertise through projects that address areas of national need. Their projects enhance research capacity and infrastructure and contribute to workforce development and job creation. For this pilot program, successful applicants will have research expertise in the chemical sciences, or in interdisciplinary areas supported by the chemical sciences. The Discovery Corps Fellowship Program comprises two categories of awards: recent doctoral recipients serve as Discovery Corps Postdoctoral Fellows; and mid-career professionals serve as Discovery Corps Senior Fellows.

Instrumentation for Materials Research - Major Instrumentation Projects NSF 03-604

This Program Solicitation establishes within the Instrumentation for Materials Research (IMR) Program in the Division of Materials Research (DMR) a new opportunity for support for the design and construction of major instruments, sited at major U.S. facilities, which cost more than \$2 million per instrument. The program is also intended to support the development of detailed conceptual and engineering design for new tools for materials preparation or characterization at major national facilities. Such instruments may include, for example, neutron beam lines, synchrotron beam lines, and high field magnets as well as development of detectors and preparation environments necessary to support materials research. The program will support two types of awards: Conceptual and Engineering Design (CED) awards and Construction (CNST) awards. A CED award will enable the proposer to do the necessary engineering design of the instrument. A CNST proposal may only be submitted after a satisfactory engineering design of the instrument has been completed and has been approved by both the facility at which the instrument will be situated and by NSF. The program will not provide operating funds for any of the projects it supports through this solicitation. Operational costs must be supported either by the facility at which the instrument is located or through some other source. DMR expects to have \$3.5 million available to support this activity in FY 2004, and to increase this level of support in future years, depending upon the availability of funds.

Biocomplexity in the Environment (BE): Integrated Research and Education in Environmental Systems NSF 03-597

This competition continues the Foundation's support of the Biocomplexity in the Environment Priority Area and promotes comprehensive, integrated investigations of environmental systems using advanced scientific and engineering methods. The concept of biocomplexity stresses the richness of biological systems and their capacity for adaptation and self-organizing behavior. By placing biocomplexity studies in an environmental context, this competition emphasizes research with the following characteristics: (a) a high degree of interdisciplinarity; (b) a focus on complex environmental systems that includes non-human biota or humans; and (c) a focus on systems with high potential for exhibiting non-linear behavior. In FY 2004 and FY 2005, five topical areas will be emphasized: 1. Dynamics of Coupled Natural and Human Systems (CNH); 2. Coupled Biogeochemical Cycles (CBC); 3. Genome-Enabled Environmental Science and Engineering (GEN-EN); 4. Instrumentation Development for Environmental Activities (IDEA); 5. Materials Use: Science, Engineering, & Society (MUSES). In all areas, quantitative modeling, simulation, analysis, and visualization methods are emphasized, as well as integration of education and a global perspective. Consistent with the guidance provided in each of the five topical areas, individuals or small groups may submit proposals to conduct research projects or exploratory and planning activities. This comprehensive approach to research on biocomplexity in the environment is expected to improve science-based predictive capabilities for decision-making.

Course, Curriculum, and Laboratory Improvement (CCLI): Adaptation and Implementation Track NSF 03-598

The Course, Curriculum, and Laboratory Improvement (CCLI) program seeks to improve the quality of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education for all students, based on research concerning needs and opportunities in undergraduate education and effective ways to address them. It targets activities affecting learning environments, course content, curricula, and educational practices, with the aim of contributing to the relevant research base that will support efforts to enhance STEM education. The CCLI program has four tracks that emphasize, respectively, the development of new educational materials and practices for a national audience (EMD); the local adaptation and implementation of previously developed exemplary materials and practices, including laboratory experiences and support for instrumentation (A&I); the national dissemination of exemplary materials and/or practices through faculty professional development (ND); and the assessment of student achievement, including research on assessment and the development of assessment tools and practices (ASA). Projects may address the needs of a single discipline or cut across disciplinary boundaries. Abstracts of previously funded projects can be found at http://www.ehr.nsf.gov/pirs_prs_web/search/ Through the Adaptation and Implementation (A&I) track, the CCLI program supports and encourages faculty, departments, and institutions to use innovative materials and practices of demonstrated effectiveness, including laboratory experiences and instrumentation. This track has been designed to increase the pace of innovation diffusion and address the "not invented here" syndrome that is often mentioned as a retardant to the diffusion of innovation. A&I proposals are expected to provide evidence that the innovative materials and practices they propose to implement have been effective on other campuses, to explain why they are anticipated to be effective for students on the proposing institution's campus, and to provide evaluation data by the end of the project. Through the subsequent synthesis of evaluation results, NSF seeks to continue building knowledge about effective practices and materials (what works under what circumstances), thereby strengthening the cycle of innovation. The A&I track is prepared to support educational improvement efforts at the departmental and even the institutional level. It is NSF's vehicle for supporting major efforts at reform.

Math Science Partnership Program NSF 03-605

The Math and Science Partnership (MSP) program is a major research and development effort that supports innovative partnerships to improve K-12 student achievement in mathematics and science. MSP projects are expected to both raise the achievement levels of all students and significantly reduce achievement gaps in the mathematics and science performance of diverse student populations. Successful projects serve as models that can be widely replicated in educational practice to improve the mathematics and science achievement of all the Nation's students. The new solicitation continues the MSP Targeted Partnerships and adds Institute Partnerships - Teacher Institutes for the 21st Century. Continuing the MSP focus on its five Key Features, Institute Partnerships are designed especially to meet national needs for teacher leaders/master teachers and school-based intellectual leaders in mathematics and science. The new solicitation also includes a very focused MSP-Research, Evaluation and Technical Assistance (RETA) component inviting proposals that directly support the work of the Institute Partnerships. The new solicitation has a focus on the secondary grades (middle and high school), although elementary mathematics/science specialists are also included in the Institute Partnerships. Awards for Partnerships are to be made to institutions of higher education or eligible nonprofit organizations (or consortia of such institutions or organizations) that enter into partnerships with one or more local educational agencies. In this solicitation, Lead Partner eligibility for MSP Targeted Partnerships is limited to institutions of higher education or eligible nonprofit organizations (or consortia of such institutions or organizations). Lead Partner eligibility for Institute Partnerships is limited to institutions of higher education only.

National Research Council – Ford Foundation Postdoctoral Fellowships for Minorities

To foster diversity on the nation's college and university faculties and campuses, the Postdoctoral Fellowships for Minorities program identifies outstanding researchers and scholars who are members of minority groups whose under representation in the professorate and in formal programs of postdoctoral study and research in the United States has been long-standing and remains severe as a result of past discrimination. The program enables fellows to engage in a year of postdoctoral research and scholarship in an environment free from the interference of their normal professional duties. In sponsoring this fellowship program, the Ford Foundation wishes to help recent doctoral recipients achieve greater recognition and develop the professional associations that will make them more effective and productive in academic employment. ELIGIBILITY: Fellowships will be offered only to individuals who are citizens or nationals of the United States and who are members of the following groups: Alaska Natives (Eskimo or Aleut); Black/African Americans; Mexican Americans/Chicanas/Chicanos; Native American Indians; Native Pacific Islanders (Micronesian/Polynesian); Puerto Ricans. Applicants are required to have earned a Ph.D. or Sc.D. degree from a U.S. educational institution no earlier than January 1997, and no later than January 17, 2004, in an eligible research-related field.
