



SAMBA on a Macintosh

Overview:

SAMBA is a utility for mapping your UNIX shell account to any of the Computers in the labs and classrooms on campus. The following applies:

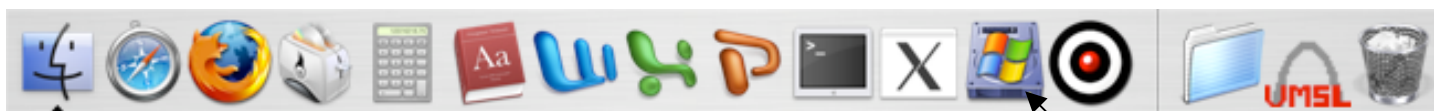
- To use this utility, you must have a UNIX SHELL account. If you do not have one, fill out the online form at: <http://www.ums.l.edu/technology/unix/index.html>
- The default quota for SHELL accounts is 100 MB.
- If you have problems logging in, ask one of the lab consultants, or visit the Technology Support Center in 211 Lucas Hall.

Usages:

- You can create, edit, and save documents directly to your account space – no more floppy disks!
- Drag and drop files directly into your UNIX account
- Stop using FTP to upload your HTML documents
- **SAVE** your work often in case the computer freezes or crashes!

To Login:

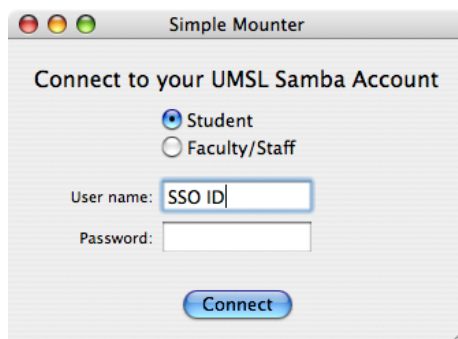
1. Select the Samba Icon from the toolbar at the bottom of your screen.

2. Enter your mygateway user name and password.

3. Click “Connect”.



4. Once you login, your UNIX account space will appear as an icon on the desktop with your Username on it.
