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### Education Coursework

**13 Hours Required**

Students pursuing an Associate of Arts in Teaching must complete the following requirements. All Education (EDU) courses must be completed with a grade of C or better to earn this degree.

Listed here are the requirements for both graduation from SCC with an Associate in Arts in Teaching and admission into the UMSL Teacher Education Program. The only exception to this is that a student must have ACT or SAT scores on file with UMSL to enter the Teacher Education Program, which is not a requirement of the Associate in Arts in Teaching.

- ☐ \*EDU 211 *Foundations of Education* (3)
- ☐ EDU 220 *Technology for Teachers* (3)
- ☐ EDU 240 *Education Psychology* (3)
- ☐ EDU 290 *Portfolio Assessment in Education* (1) completed with a grade of C or higher.
- ☐ Students must hold a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- ☐ Students must earn a score of 235 or higher in each of the areas of English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Writing of the C-BASE exam.

\* Both EDU 210 & 211 must be taken at SCC for transfer into UMSL's Education Program.

### Electives

**7 Hours Required**

After completion of the General Education, Associate of Arts students must also complete a number of elective hours to reach 64 total.
