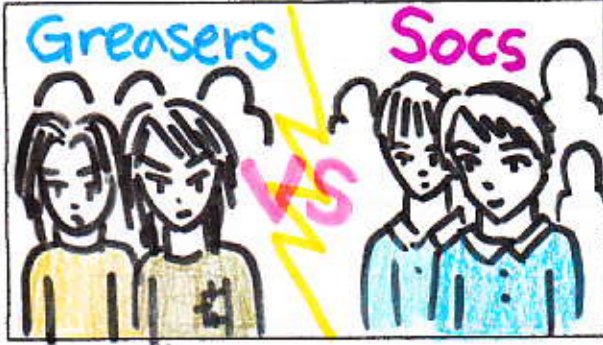


STORYBOARD (Name) _____



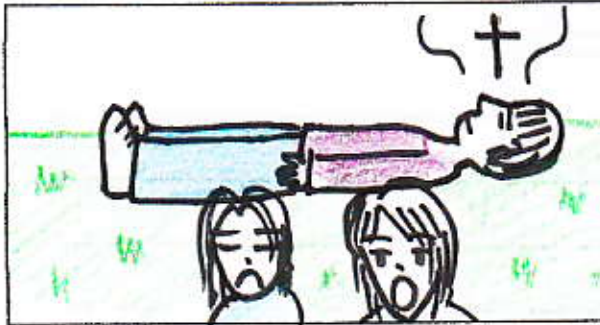

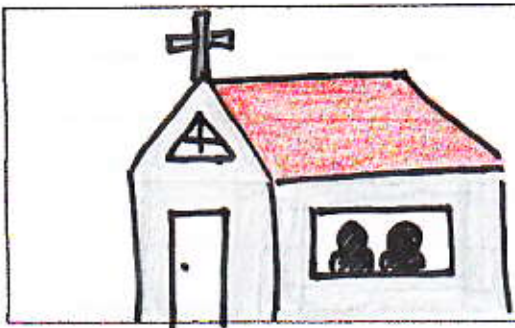
