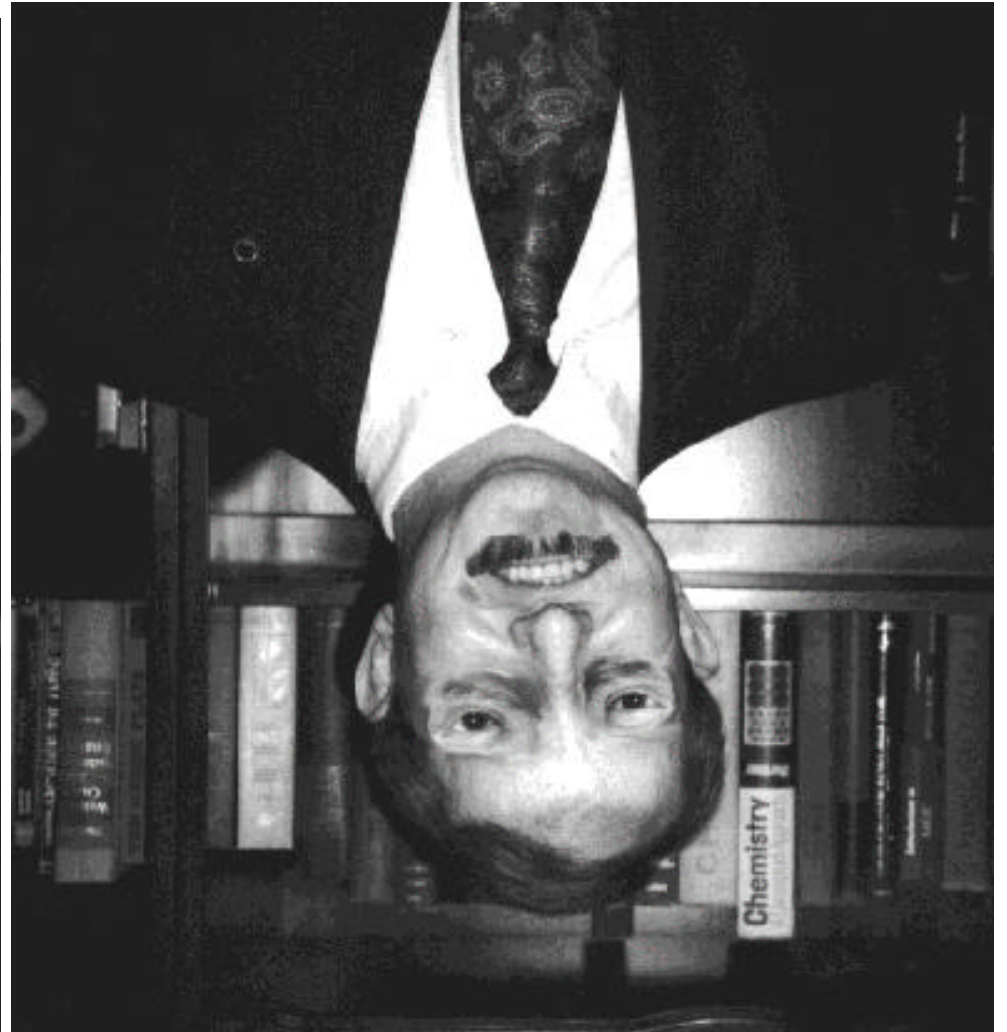


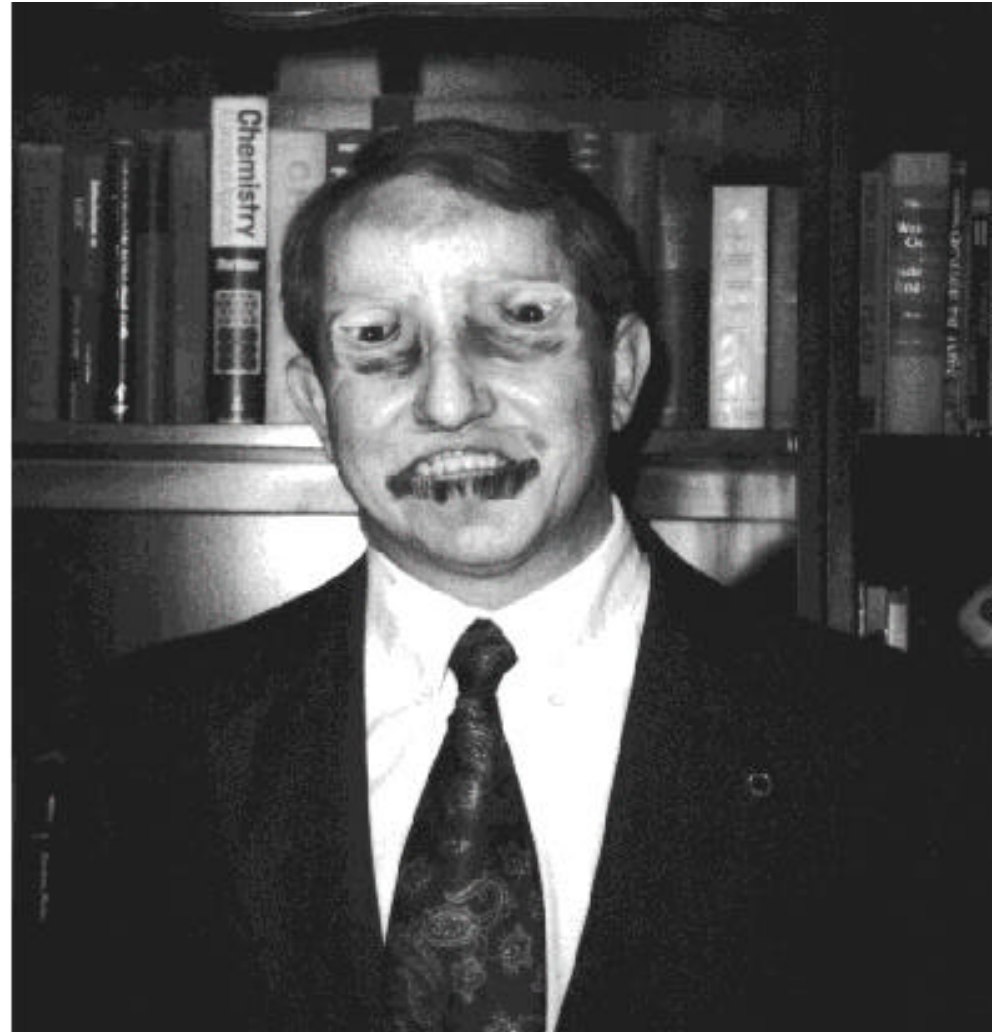
We see what we expect to see.
