[Abstracts in Social Gerontology](#)

Abstracts in Social Gerontology includes bibliographic records covering essential areas related to social gerontology, including the psychology of aging, elder abuse, society and the elderly, and other areas of key relevance to the discipline.

[Academic Search Complete](#)

A scholarly, multidisciplinary full-text database, with more than 8,600 full-text periodicals, including more than 7,500 peer-reviewed journals.

[AgeSource / AgeStats Worldwide](#)

AgeSource Worldwide provides access to resources from 25 countries covering aging-related issues. AgeStats Worldwide provides access to statistical data that compare the situation of older adults across countries or regions around a variety of issues.

[PsychINFO](#)

Provides citations with abstracts to the scholarly literature in the psychological, social, behavioral, and health sciences.

[Social Work Abstracts](#)

Contains information on the fields of social work and human services from more than 450 journals. Topics include: Theory and practice, areas of service, social issues, and social problems.

These databases are available on campus and remotely with a UM-St. Louis SSO ID and password.

Tips for Searching the Databases:

- Use the truncation or wildcard symbol (*) to search variant word endings:
 - age* = age, ages, aged
- Combine different concepts using **AND**: Combine synonyms using **OR**:
 age* **AND** mobil* old* **OR** elder*
- Limit your results by: *Date, Peer Reviewed*, etc.
 - *Only use two or three delimiters at a time to prevent reduced results.*
- Don't limit your search to full-text articles – let [ArticleLinker](#) help you find the full text.

If an article is not available in print or online at UMSL, request the article through [InterLibrary Loan \(ILL\)](#).

You can search for books in the same way as you search for articles:

- Use truncation or the wildcard symbol (*) to search variant word endings:
 - age* = age, ages, aged
- Combine different concepts using **AND**: Combine synonyms using **OR**:
age* **AND** mobil* old* **OR** elder*
- Call number ranges for Gerontology:
 - **RC 952 - RC 954.6** – Books on geriatrics.
 - **HQ 1060 – HQ 1064** – Books on aging, the social aspects of gerontology and retirement.
 - **HV 1450 – HV 1494** – Books on the aged.
- When a book is unavailable from the UMSL Libraries or if you are not finding enough books, you can search the [MOBIUS Union Catalog](#).
