HAWAIIAN *Volcanoes* CRUCIBLE OF CREATION

The purpose of this travel study course is to introduce the student to the world of volcanology in the best possible way, by visiting one of the world's most active volcanic islands – the so-called Big Island of Hawaii. You will witness first-hand the powerful forces that have shaped our planet for billions of years.

The tour will include visits to Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, which contains the Hawaiian Volcano Observatory on the edge of Kilauea Caldera. Kilauea is among the world's most active volcanoes, so there is a very good chance that the trip will include an opportunity to safely witness an eruption. During this course you will learn such things as:

- What makes volcanoes
- How the Hawaiian Islands chain was formed
- How many volcanoes are on the Big Island
- Which volcanoes are still active
- What the different types of lava and eruptive products are, and how they form



ACCOMMODATIONS

Students will be staying at the Holo Holo In, Hostel & Budget Inn, located in a beautiful rainforest. The Inn is approximately 1.5 miles from the most active volcano in the world – Kilauea Crater. In Hawaiian, “holo holo” means “leisurely journey,” and this is the spirit reflected in the atmosphere of the Inn.
