## Graduate Program Update from Barbara Graham

As many of you know, 2007-2008 is a year of transition in the Department of Political Science. Eduardo Silva, formerly the Director of Graduate Studies for the past six years, is now Chair of the Department and I accepted the offer to serve as the new Director of Graduate Studies. To date, I have spent most of my time familiarizing myself with the policies and procedures of our graduate program, devising effective ways to communicate with our graduate students, and getting to know them. With a semester's worth of graduate director experience, I can say without reservation that our graduate program is on solid ground. As in many other areas of the University, institutional and budget constraints have hampered our efforts to expand our program and grow in stature. One of my primary objectives as graduate director is to seek ways to alleviate these obstacles to our program's continued growth and success in graduate education and training.

Here is a brief program update. At present, we have thirty-five doctoral students and eight master's students enrolled in our graduate program. Our newest master's students are Jamie Campbell (FS 07) and Stephanie Nezam (WS 08). We welcomed three new Ph.D. students into the program: Christopher Dolle (FS 07), Jennifer Edwards (FS 07) and Bryce Summary (WS 08). We proudly hooded two new Ph.D.'s last December, Shellagh Thomas (David Robertson, Chair) and Courtney Andrews (Andy Glassberg, Chair). Daniel Sternemann (Lana Stein, Chair) earned his Master's degree in December. The vitality of our program is exhibited by nine doctoral students who recently advanced to candidacy: Leesa Althen, Diane Brandt, Mary Carver, Kimberly Casey, Richard Ehui, Rochelle Henderson, Anna Martirosyan, Alan Noory, Uchechukwu Oluku and Andre Smith.

The academic performance of several of our graduate students is first rate. Last fall, two of our Master's and Ph.D. students received Graduate School awards. Daniel Sternemann received the "Outstanding Graduate Student in the Master's Program in Political Science" award for \$2,000. Cassie Gross received the "Outstanding Graduate Student in the Doctoral Program in Political Science" award for \$4,000. The Graduate School also selected Daniel Sternemann to serve as a graduate student marshal for the December 2007 commencement. Our graduate students have amassed an impressive list of conference participation at the major political science meetings due in large part to the financial assistance from the Political Science Graduate Student Association.

Continuity and change continues to be a consistent theme with our program. One exciting new development that is sponsored by the Graduate Program is the Political Science Department's Monthly Colloquium series where Political Science faculty members present their research to a departmental audience. The Graduate Program continues to sponsor the "Noon Series" which gives graduate students an opportunity to present their research, practice job talks and papers for professional conferences. The Political Science Graduate Student Association, under the leadership of Leesa Althen, continues to sponsor the "Brown Bag" presentations on topics of interest to our graduate students. And, of course, "Happy Hour" at

Cicero's in the University City loop takes place once a month on Fridays for additional intellectual conversation and socializing. The UM-St. Louis Political Science Graduate Program is actively recruiting potential master's and doctoral students. We have considerable strength in urban politics and policy, American politics, comparative politics, and international relations. Our M.A. and Ph.D. programs are geared toward part time as well as full time students. We also have students who currently teach at the secondary level in the St. Louis area. Our undergraduate students have an excellent opportunity to earn a B.A. and a Master's degree in five years in our 2 + 3 BA/MA program.

### Political Science Academy Lecture Series

Professor Jacob S. Hacker lectured on "The Great Risk Shift: The Growing Economic Insecurity of American Families - And What Should Be Done About It" on Wednesday, May 2 for our 5th lecture.

Jacob Hacker is Professor of Political Science at Yale University and Fellow at the New America Foundation. He is author of several books and is a frequent commentator on NPR, PBS, and CNN.

### Political Science Academy

The Political Science Academy is up and running. Their October meeting was held at the home of Prof. Jones. The guest speaker was John Hickey, Executive Director, Missouri Progressive Vote Coalition. In November Prof. Marty Rochester hosted Victor Levine, Political Science Professor, Washington University. He spoke on "Iraq, Iran, and other Hotspots in the Middle East: An update. The department's own Prof. Joel Glassman will be the guest speaker in March at Prof. David Robertson's home. The talk will be on "China on the Eve of the Beijing Olympics: Approaching Great Power Status."

**Faculty Profiles**

Associate Professor **Nancy Kinney**, whose research focuses on nonprofit organizations engaged in public policy,



traveled to Southern Sudan in December to learn about the development efforts undertaken there by a Missouri faith-based organization. She visited the town of Lui in Mundri County, near the southern border with Uganda. While in Lui, she met with

officials of the provisional government in Southern Sudan to discuss public-private initiatives. Shown here (from left) is Dr. Kinney; Robert Franken (her husband); His Excellency Col. Joseph Ngere Paulu, Deputy Governor of Western Equatoria, and (at far right) East Mundri County Commissioner, Wilson Api. Bishop Bullen Dolli (shown with a cane), the Episcopal Bishop of Lui Diocese, arranged the meeting. Since the Comprehensive Peace Agreement, the people of Southern Sudan have enjoyed the cessation of hostilities, but communities like Lui face a dire health care situation and a profound lack of educational resources. Support for needed development in countries like Sudan is overwhelmingly provided by private (rather than governmental) sources in the U.S., which underscores the role played by non-governmental social institutions like the church.

**Farida Jalalzai** has two forthcoming articles for 2008, "Women Rule-Shattering the Executive Glass Ceiling," for *Politics & Gender* and "Political Widowhood in the United States: An Empirical Assessment of Underlying Assumptions of Representation" (with Chad A. Hankinson) for the *Journal of Women, Politics & Policy*. She has also submitted a book chapter, "Women's Political Representation Worldwide" in *Women of the World*, Edited by Joyce Gelb and Marian Lief Palley. In the spring of 2008 she will be presenting at the following conference, PSA Women and Politics in Surrey, England; Portuguese Political Science Association in Lisbon, Portugal and the Midwestern Political Science Association in Chicago. Prof. Jalalzai invited to talk to the Wednesday Club in St. Louis this fall and to the St. Louis Chapter of the National Women's Political

Caucus in the spring. Farida received the IWGS Small Grants in the spring 2006 and UMSL Small Grants this fall. She has been appointed campus advisor for the Sue Shear Institute for Women in Public Life, 21st Century Leadership Academy.

**Terry Jones** has written a chapter "Ahead of the Curve? Planning in St. Louis County," in the just published *St. Louis Plans*, edited by Mark Tranel (Missouri Historical Society Press, 2007).

**Marty Rochester** has just authored a new book entitled *US Foreign Policy in the 21st Century: Gulliver's Travails* (Westview Press) that has received glowing reviews from some major scholars. Charles Kupchan of the Council on Foreign Relations and Georgetown University says it "offers not only an insightful lay of the land but also a sensible road map to guide U.S. statecraft." Lawrence Korb, former U.S. Assistant Secretary of Defense and Senior Fellow as the Center for American Progress, says "In this age of terrorists, tyrants, and weapons of mass destruction, American political and military leaders will be confronted with difficult choices. In this well-written book, Marty Rochester lays out the five dilemmas these men and women will face as they make these choices. A must read for students as well as policy makers." Jeffrey Pickering, a professor at Kansas State University and past president of the Foreign Policy Analysis section of the International Studies Association—and an alumnus of the UMSL political science program—calls it "an incredibly 'smart' book. If I could choose only one book to supplement the basic textbook assigned to undergraduate international relations and foreign policy classes, this would definitely be it." His book published last year, *Between Peril and Promise: The Politics of International Law* (Congressional Quarterly Press) was praised in the American Society of International Law newsletter as a "fabulous" addition to the literature "to support courses in law and politics" and "authoritative" in "asking the right questions."

Marty also was invited to participate as a member of the American Political Science Association delegation to China for two weeks in June of 2007. In addition, he and his wife Ruth just celebrated the birth of their fourth grandchild.

**Eduardo Silva** was invited to participate on a panel on the Chilean economy at a seminar December 3 on Chile organized by The Bureau of Intelligence and Research, U.S. Department of State for Ambassador Paul Simons.

**Kenny Thomas** gave a lecture in November in Geneva, Switzerland, for the launch of an 80-page report he wrote on investment incentive worldwide. The sponsor is the Global Subsidies Initiative of the International Institute for Sustainable Development, a Canadian non-governmental organization. The study is titled "Investment Incentive: Growing use, uncertain benefits, uneven controls."
