Note: Students who have earned 24 or more transferable hours of credit at any accredited post-secondary institution before the start of the Fall 2002 semester may choose to meet the general education requirements of the 2001-02 catalog or the 2002 catalog at UMSL.

The new University of Missouri-St. Louis General Education Program complies fully with the Missouri Coordinating Board of Higher Education Guidelines on Transfer and Articulation (June 2000). All students, native and transfer, must complete a 42-hour block of courses in six goal areas: Communicating Skills, Managing Information Skills, Valuing Skills, Social and Behavioral Sciences Knowledge, Humanities and Fine Arts Knowledge, and Mathematics and Life/Natural Sciences. **Many courses satisfy more than one goal. Courses which meet more than one goal appear in bold type. Once students have met the required number of courses or hours under each goal, they may take any of the general education courses listed below to achieve the 42-hour block.**
