Barnes College of Nursing accepts 64 hours of general education credit; plus, 39 credit hours of nursing clinicals are granted upon receipt of student's RN license and successful completion of *NURSE 3900 Dimensions of Professional Nursing* at the University of Missouri- St. Louis.

To be eligible for the B.S.N. Completion program, students must have an Associates Degree in Nursing or diploma from a state board approved nursing program, a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale on all transferable college work attempted, at least 30 hours of transferable, non-nursing coursework, and provide evidence of current licensure as a registered nurse with eligibility for licensure in Missouri.
