Eurogang Youth Survey

Eurogang definition: "A youth gang, or troublesome youth group, is a durable, street-oriented youth group whose involvement in illegal activity is part of their group identity."

Instrument development: At conclusion of the second Eurogang meeting (convened in Oslo, Norway during September 1999), workgroups to tackle specific methodological and definitional concerns were established. The "community/youth" working group was charged with discussion of strategies that might prove beneficial for measuring gang membership and gang characteristics, precursors (or risk factors) associated with gang joining, and community factors associated with youth gangs. Early discussion led the group to a focus on developing a questionnaire focused on youth: an instrument that could be administered in interview or questionnaire format in a variety of contexts. Over the ensuing four years, the working group met during Eurogang meetings (Egmond an Zee, the Netherland, 2000; Straubing, Germany, 2002 and 2003) as well as communicated via email to develop the youth instrument. Following the 2002 meeting, a working draft was circulated to working members and researchers in six countries translated the instrument (see below) and pre-tests were conducted in six countries. Translation issues and pre-test results were presented and discussed at the 2003 meeting and a final English or, as some would say, American version was presented to the entire Eurogang group for approval.

Pre-testing: Pre-testing was conducted in both school settings and juvenile detention facilities. Depending upon location, pre-testing consisted of in-person interviews as well as group self-administered questionnaires. Some pre-testers debriefed respondents, asking for feedback regarding wording, content, and sequencing of questions. Pre-tests were conducted in the following locations:

France: in-person interviews with 10 youths aged 17 - 18 years

Germany: self-administered questionnaires (in-school) completed by 26 students aged 13 – 15 years

Netherlands: self-administered questionnaires (in-school) completed by 18 students 15 years of age Norway: self-administered questionnaires (in multiple schools) completed by 1,917 students 15-17 years of age

Russia: self-administered questionnaires (in 6 schools - 3 each in Moscow and Kazan) completed by 350 students aged 12 - 17 years

USA: in-person interviews with 67 juvenile detention detainees (in Albany, NY and St. Louis, MO) aged $12-18\ years$

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Youth Questionnaire: Eurogang Program of Research

This questionnaire was developed as part of the Eurogang Program of Research and consists of questions drawn from a number of studies of juvenile delinquency and youth gangs, including the National Youth Survey (Elliott et al. 1985), the Denver Youth Survey (Huizinga et al. 1992), the National Evaluation of the G.R.E.A.T. Program (Esbensen et al. 2001), and several studies of California youth (Maxson et al. 1998).

There are two types of questions included in this questionnaire: 1) those necessary to establish that the groups conform with the Eurogang definition of youth gang (#57, 58, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 70, 70a, 71, 72, 73, 78, 79, 80, 81, 87); and 2) the remainder are highly recommended given prior research experience in the study of youth gangs.
