Total commitment of \$10.8 million


## Thanks to Gary Forsee, Gordon Lamb, Curators, Senator Bray, elected officials & just about everyone in this room

- Missouri General Assembly approved \$2.8 million in equity funding
- Total annual equity funding since 2005 to \$8.3 million
- \$300,000 also earmarked for optometry-nursing building planning


#### Criminologist Wins St. Louis Award


63 doctoral, 743 master's degrees set records as well

• Michael McFarland received the top score among 1,300 student optometrists taking the first phase of the national licensure exam in 2007. UMSL's first-time pass rate as a whole was 91%, compared to the national average of 84%.

#### Nurses score well on exam

■ First-time pass rate of nursing graduates on state licensing exam was 93% – the sixth consecutive year scores exceeded 90% and were greater than the state & national average

#### **UMSL Singers Make Some Noise**





**African-American nursing conference** draws 340 people focusing on present, past contributions of African-American nurses and a panel discussion on diversity in the workplace and higher education






