About the Position

The Department of Mathematics and Computer Science at the University of Missouri-St. Louis (UMSL) invites applications for a non-tenure-track assistant teaching professor, or a one-year visiting faculty position, in Computer Science beginning Fall 2019. Salary is competitive and dependent upon qualifications.

The department seeks applicants with proven teaching ability in Computer Science courses and good communications skills. The position has no research requirement. A minimum of Master's degree is required in Computer Science or a closely-related discipline, with experience in computing and teaching. Of particular interest are full-stack skills but all applicants will be considered. Responsibilities will include teaching 3 or 4 courses per semester in Computer Science based on the candidate's strength and experience.

Candidates must submit a cover letter, a curriculum vita and a teaching statement. Documents should be packaged as a single pdf file and submitted through the university online submission system at <https://www.umsl.edu/services/hrs/careers/faculty.html> under Prospective Faculty, job number 30536.
