I envisioned walking up a mountain with a heavy rope on my shoulder. I could struggle getting up that mountain with a heavy rope, the rope symbolized the pressure leaders carry with running a company and I envisioned the employees of the company holding the other end of the rope. I envisioned either being pulled back down the mountain because people did not believe in me or the mission of the company. I realized I needed a different scenario and that entailed me carrying the rope on my shoulders with people walking along side of me carrying part of the burden because they believed in me. You get to the top either way, one way takes you longer because you are pulled back down constantly and once you reach the top you are by yourself; I chose to reach the top with other people that believed in me. The way you treat people can have a huge impact on the success of your business.

Again, as I said I am a visual person so just image this scenario. You have a video tape in your mind as you approach difficult situations within the company. Remember, you are videotaping your interactions with everyone you come in contact with. Would you be proud enough of that interaction to use it as a training video to show other employees how they should treat each

other or would you be embarrassed for your employees to see how you act or BOSS other people? I will take it one step further, would you be proud enough of your interactions to take that imaginary videotape home and show your parents or your children how Mom or Dad acts at work? If the answer is no, you probably need more training on how to be a motivating leader.

A leader has passion, a leader leads by example, a leader is someone that inspires people to WANT to follow/emulate them, a leader is someone who has followers that trust him or her. The most important trait of a leader would have to be the ability to influence others at all levels of an organization towards a common goal, and finally a leader has character.

Zig Ziglar was once quoted as saying, "You can have everything in life you want if you just help enough people get what they want."
