Computer Science Department Degrees, Undergraduate Requirements

General Education Requirements

All department majors must satisfy the university and appropriate school or college general education requirements. All mathematics courses may be used to meet the university's general education breadth of study requirement in natural sciences and mathematics.

Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory Restrictions

All department majors may not take mathematical and computer sciences courses Courses required for a major program or a certificate cannot be taken on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis. Students considering graduate study should consult with their advisers about taking work on a satisfactory/unsatisfactory basis.

Degree Requirements Computer Science Courses

All courses of the department presented to meet the degree requirements Courses required for a major program or a certificate must be completed with a grade of C-or better. At least four courses numbered 3000 or above must be taken in residence for a major program. Students must have a minimum of 2.0 grade point average in computer science courses completed the CMP SCI courses.

A minimum All prerequisite courses must be passed with a grade of C- or better is required to meet the prerequisite requirement for any course except with permission of the department unless explicitly stated otherwise.

Students who are ready to begin their program with CMP SCI 2250, Programming and Data Structures, but lack proper or transfer for the prerequisite CMP SCI 1250, Introduction to Computing, will be granted credit for CMP SCI 1250, Introduction to Computing, once they complete CMP SCI 2250 with a grade of C- or better. Interested students must reach out to their faculty advisor.

Note: Courses that are prerequisites for higher-level courses may not be taken for credit or quality points if the higher-level course has been satisfactorily completed.
