Program Requirements

All students must complete the program requirements as well as the emphasis area courses.

All candidates in the B.S.Ed. Early Childhood Education program are required to successfully complete the following Teacher Education courses as well as the

required Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) performance assessment.

Professional education Education courses must be completed with a grade point average 3.0 and no grade lower than a C of C or better (a grade of C- or below must be retaken).

NOTE: Beginning with those students graduating in May, 2017 and receiving teacher certification, the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary requires a 3.0 GPA in professional education courses, a 3.0 GPA in teaching content field, and a 2.75 overall GPA.

To be recommended for certification, candidates must satisfy all DESE requirements for grade point average and for certification-specific assessments.

Students must pass the relevant exit test to receive the B.S.Ed. degree.
