Music Bachelor, Music Education Emphasis

In addition to the requirement for a successful audition on their primary instrument, piano and guitar students applying for the BM: Music Education program must also successfully audition for the full participation in (1) Applied Music (seven hours) and University Singers (for those seeking vocal/choral certification), or (2) Symphonic Band, Wind Ensemble, or Orchestra (for those seeking instrumental certification).

In addition to the required music core curriculum, candidates must complete the following:

Other General Education Requirements¹

All B.M. in Music Education majors must meet the university and college general education requirements.

GPA Requirement

Students enrolled in B.M. in music education must maintain minimum GPAs (2.75 cumulative; 3.0 music; and 3.0 professional education).

Proficiency Exam

Students working toward certification in choral/vocal or instrumental music K-12 are required to pass a keyboard proficiency examination before admission to student teaching in music, usually before or during the sixth semester of their program.

Justification for request:

There are two proposed changes to this degree program:

1) First, we are proposing the combination of several PDGOGY classes. Specifically, we propose that PDGOGY 1250 and 1260 be dropped and replaced by PDGOGY 1230 (a new class that will streamline and combine the educational content from 1250 and 1260); similarly, we are proposing that PDGOGY 1270 and 1280 be dropped and replaced by PDGOGY 1240 (a new class that will streamline and combine the educational content from 1270 and 1280). This will accomplish two goals for us. (A) The reduction of credits from this degree (approx. 139) has been encouraged by administration numerous times, as it will allow students to graduate in a more efficient and cost-effective manner. Combining these classes in this way eliminate 4 credits from this degree. (B) As they exist at present, these classes are often low on enrollment, which

causes course cancelation and ad hoc ways of filling these degree requirements. By combing these classes in this way, we will be able to adjust our schedule of when they are offered to allow for larger enrollments.

2) The second change is a "clean up" change. Under "Professional Education and Student Teaching," four classes are being "added" -- TCH ED 1001, 2001, 3001, and 3310. These classes were added as degree requirements approximately six years ago. They are requirements put forth by DESE for state teaching certification. The College of Education has followed suit, and we have as well (our students have all been taking these classes already), but due to communication issues, the changes never officially made it on to our Bulletin description. We have also changed some wording (eliminating the "Level I," "Level II," "Level III" headers) to better align with current terminology in education degrees housed in the COE.
