Rationale

The DNP Faculty have considered and approved a recommendation to change the title of the program to "Leadership in Healthcare Systems". The purpose of the new program track is to provide succession planning and education for nurse administrators and nurse leaders. Two new courses are proposed in addition to an existing course which enhance compliance with standards required by the AONE and ANCC certifications for leadership. The current NURSE 6418 Organizational Behavior is proposed to have a human resources component added to it; new courses would include N6526 Healthcare Finance and N6527 Patient Safety, Performance Improvement, and Compliance to meet recommended standards.

Bulletin Description First in a two-semester course sequence that will detail the general anatomy of the human body along with the histology (microanatomy), physiology and disease processes of major organ systems. Course content will be presented in a modular format. Areas of discussion will include cardiovascular, respiratory, endocrine, digestive, reproductive, integumentary and peripheral and autonomic nervous systems. The laboratories will emphasize and augment important concepts introduced in the classroom environment.

Justification for change: The number of credit hours for this course is being increased from 4 to 5. The number credit hours for the OPTOM 8110 (APD II) course is being reduced from 5 to 4.
