Rationale

A steady and increasing demand for Child Advocacy Studies (CAST) courses justifies offering the proposed AP-CAST degree. Since Fall 2014, CAST has experienced a 246% increase in student enrollment growth. Likewise, strong employer demand for graduates with CAST certificates and minors also justifies expanding the CAST program with survey results indicating a highly favorable hiring climate for graduates of an AP-CAST baccalaureate degree. AP-CAST's commitment to offering the degree in a fully online format will make this innovative program accessible to students across the state, region and nation and train them to address the significant and costly public health issues associated with exposure to childhood traumatic stress.
