The faculty has developed a new curriculum plan of study and courses for the 15 month accelerated BSN option. The BSN program outcomes are the same for all 4 BSN options (4 vear traditional, part-time evening & weekend, accelerated and RN to BSN completion). The credit hours required for the degree are the same as that of the other pre-licensure nursing majors. Many of the accelerated students are second degree majors with several years of college. This new curriculum and courses are designed to better meet the learning needs of this group of students. The accelerated students currently enroll in separate sections of nursing courses, so no increase in costs for the student or the College of Nursing is associated with this curriculum change.
