

New Program

Minor in Military History and Logistics

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This interdisciplinary minor educates students in the art and science of military operations and processes through rigorous academic grounding in military history, business logistics, and organizational leadership theory. It is ideally suited for students pursuing professional careers in intelligence, the armed forces, and other military-related fields. It is also intended as a supplemental course of study for students enrolled in the Reserve Officer Training Corps program.

Students must receive a grade of "C" or higher in required courses.

Program Requirements

Core

All students must take 9-credits of core courses consisting of:
