Accelerated BSN Program

In addition to the traditional full-time and part-time options, the College of Nursing offers coursework leading to the Bachelor of Science in nursing (BSN) through an accelerated program option. The program is designed for students to complete degree studies the clinical track in 15 months.

Pre-Clinical Admission Criteria

Applicants who plan to complete their general education/prerequisite coursework at the University of Missouri-St. Louis must apply to the university as pre-clinical nursing students. It is important to note that admission as a pre-clinical nursing student does not guarantee admission into the clinical track of any of the pre-licensure BSN options (Traditional full-time, Traditional part-time, or Accelerated), unless a student is admitted to the traditional BSN option under the Freshman Guaranteed Clinical Criteria.

Applicants with 24 or more transferable college credit hours 1 from a regionally accredited college or university who meet the following minimum criteria may qualify for admission to the nursing major as a pre-clinical student:

All students must apply to the university as pre-clinical nursing students, which is the first step in the admission process for the Nursing major. Admission to UMSL as a pre-clinical nursing student does not guarantee admission into the clinical track of any of the Pre-Licensure BSN Options (Traditional Full-Time, Traditional Part-Time or Accelerated), unless a student is admitted to the Traditional Full-Time Option under the Freshman Guaranteed Clinical Criteria.

Students who meet the following minimum criteria are eligible to declare Nursing as their major. Such students must still apply competitively for a clinical space as they near the completion of their general education coursework (see Clinical Admission Criteria below).

- Admission to UMSL
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 (GPA is calculated on all attempts of all transferable undergraduate courses)

Revised criteria, applicable to students admitted <u>Summer 2017 and later</u>:

- Admission to UMSL
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 (including all transferable courses)

Clinical Admission Criteria: Accelerated

Clinical spaces are awarded on a competitive and space-available basis for each admission period. Admission to the University of Missouri-St. Louis and the College of Nursing (as a pre-clinical student) does *not* guarantee admission into the clinical track of the Accelerated BSN option any of the Pre-Licensure BSN Options (Traditional Full-Time, Traditional Part-Time or Accelerated), unless a student is admitted to the Traditional Full-Time Option under the Freshman Guaranteed Clinical Criteria.

Applicants Clinical applicants must meet the following *minimum* criteria to apply for a clinical space in the Accelerated BSN-Option:

- Admission to UMSL
- A Baccalaureate Degree in another field of study from a regionally accredited college or university or completion of at least 62 college credit hours before the start of the program
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 for students with a Baccalaureate Degree
 baccalaureate degree in another field of study; or minimum cumulative GPA of
 3.2 for applicants students without a Baccalaureate Degree baccalaureate
 degree in another field of study (GPA is calculated on all attempts of all
 transferable undergraduate courses)
- Required science courses (Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy & Physiology II and Microbiology) completed within 10 years prior to enrollment
- Completion of all general education course requirements

¹ Once an applicant has earned 24 or more transferable college credit hours from a regionally accredited college or university, we do not take ACT score and/or high school GPA into consideration for admissions purposes.

Grade of C or higher in all prerequisite courses

Revised criteria, applicable to students applying for clinical admission <u>Summer</u> 2017 and later:

- Admission to UMSL
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2 (including all transferable courses), regardless
 of whether or not the applicant holds a baccalaureate degree in another field
 of study
- Satisfactory completion of all general education course requirements
- Grade of B- or higher within 5 years of clinical enrollment in the following courses: Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy & Physiology II, Microbiology
- Grade of C- or higher in all *prerequisite* courses except in the case of the above-listed science courses

Application deadlines for the Accelerated track

To be admitted to the accelerated track that begins in May of each year only, all materials must be submitted to the College of Nursing, Office of Student Services by the following dates:

- Early acceptance deadline September 15
- After September 15, on a space-available basis

Application deadline for the clinical track

To be considered for admission to the clinical track, all application materials must be submitted to the College of Nursing by the following date:

Summer admission - September 15

Students are required to complete standardized assessment exams throughout the program and at completion as part of the program evaluation.

Rationale

Based on the rigor of the nursing curriculum, we have made several changes that we believe are necessary for student success. Preclinical admission: We increased the cumulative GPA requirement for transfer students from 2.5 to 3.0. admission: We changed the cumulative GPA requirement to a 3.2 for all students (regardless of whether or not the student already holds a baccalaureate degree in another field of study). Additionally, we changed the required grade for prerequisite courses (except the 4 major science courses) from a C to a C-, to be consistent with university requirements. And we changed the grade required in the 4 major science courses (Chemistry, Anatomy & Physiology I, Anatomy & Physiology II and Microbiology) from a C to a B-, while also requiring that these 4 courses be completed within 5 years of clinical enrollment (previously 10 years).

General Education block is moved into degree requirements with the specific Gen Ed language for the Accelerated BSN Option.
