# **Doctor of Nursing Practice**

### **Admission Requirements**

The deadline for DNP applications for admission is April 1. Admission may be considered at a later date depending on space.

- Graduation from an MSN program or post-MSN APN certificate program with national nursing accreditation GPA of 3.0 or higher at the BSN or MSN level
- 2 Reference reference letters
- A proposed DNP project that matches faculty expertise
- Interview by invitation
- Evidence of eligibility for advanced practice certification or current certification in an advanced practice role an RN license in the state of Missouri or compact state
- If entering with an MSN as an APRN, advanced practice certification or current certification in an advanced practice role
- Current or eligible for advanced practice nursing recognition in Missouri or eligible for recognition as an advanced practice nurse in Missouri

The DNP curriculum is divided into 4 general categories:

- Leadership development and change
- Policy
- Practice-focused evaluation/translational research
- Clinical excellence

A graduate level general statistics course completed within the previous five years is a prerequisite to NURSE 7230, Epidemiology and is required prior to the first fall semester. Such a course may be taken concurrently with NURSE 7401 Research Institute I during the first summer semester of the program.

#### The DNP Curriculum focuses on three tiers:

- 1. Foundational Concepts
- 2. Clinical Expertise
- 3. Integration of Practice
