Report of the Chairperson (Dr. Erika Gibb):

• Dr. Gibb reported that the Board of Curators are scheduled to meet on UMSL campus on Thursday, November 20.

Report of the Chancellor (Dr. Kristin Sobolik):

- Chancellor Sobolik encouraged attendees to check out the CUMU website and stated that next year the conference will be in Houston.
- Transform UMSL Updates from Chancellor Sobolik
 - Thomas Jefferson and Mercantile Library official opening was on November 19 with the Board of Curators; Chancellor will ring the Mercantile Library bell.
 - o Innovation Center opened last week.
 - o Supply Chain Center for Excellence is now open.
 - o New SSB building on the former Tower site will be called Summit Hall.
- Chancellor Sobolik also provided an update on UMSL Athletics.
 - Across all teams, UMSL holds a combined record of 40 wins, 14 losses, and 8 ties—an impressive .710 winning percentage.
 - o The women's soccer team won the regular season title and secured their second NCAA tournament bid.
 - o The women's volleyball team clinched their third season title and will also advance to the NCAA tournament, finishing undefeated in GLVC play.

- Encouraged students and staff to download the UMSL Guardian App, which includes a location-sharing feature for virtual escorts.

Representing the UMSL Retiree Association, Dr. Ganz shared the following information about the Retiree Association.
