Justification for request:

The BES program is intentionally reducing its core curriculum from 32 to 18 credit hours to focus on the courses that every BES student needs to be successful. The previous 32-hour core was significantly larger than those of similar programs and students were not consistently completing all required courses. This revision emphasizes clarity and purpose in defining what makes a BES graduate and preparing them for internships, while giving students more freedom to explore emphasis areas and electives that align with their passions and career goals.
