Betsy Sampson (sampsone) (02/10/26 12:28 pm): We want to improve access to continuing education for active-duty and veteran Army students. [May pursue expanding to other armed forces at a later time.] Essentially, the program is designed to give transfer credit for MOS-68c training [Army Licensed Practical Nurse Education] to students that have completed the associated military courses and passed a state board examination (NCLEX-PN). The program is also uniquely tailored to accommodate ROTC students that have MOS-68c training and are pursuing a BSN. ROTC students require additional military courses and a month-long training during the summer, so the "integrator courses" required for degree attainment can be integrated as needed following transfer of credit and audit of degree requirements and still meet the funding criteria (ie completion within 2 years from start) for ROTC students that meet enrollment criteria stated above.
