# **Educational Specialist in School Psychology**

The EdS in School Psychology degree program at the University of Missouri-St. Louis is the only National Association of School Psychologists-accredited specialist level program in the state of Missouri. This degree is designed to prepare future school psychologists to be data-based problem solvers and to assume a wide array of professional roles in schools. Particular attention is placed upon interventions and educational outcomes within a cognitive-behavioral theoretical perspective, as well as emphasizing data-based decision-making, educational and psychological treatment outcomes, social justice, program development and evaluation, and facilitation of organizational/system change.

The EdS in School Psychology at UMSL is a small cohort program consisting of 10-12 candidates per cohort. This helps to maximize close relationships with faculty and field-based supervisors to develop professional skills and competencies. The program consists of 60 credit hours and includes coursework in psychological and educational foundations, psychoeducational assessment, and direct and indirect service delivery. Prevention and early intervention of academic, behavioral and social-emotional problems through consultation, interdisciplinary collaboration and systems-level interventions are also highlighted throughout the program. What's more, graduates of the program are immediately eligible for School Psychologist Certification from the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education and the Nationally Certified School Psychologist credential from the National Association of School Psychologists.
