Master of Arts in Economics

UMSL's Master of Arts in Economics program is specifically designed for those seeking to work as professional economists. Our students acquire knowledge, as well as a versatile set of skills, that are highly valued in the workplace. In fact, our MA program has an excellent track record of placing graduates in private sector and government jobs, as well as in top PhD programs. (See recent placements in our newsletters at umsl.edu/~econ/alumni/newsletter.html) A recent survey of alumni found that 95 percent of our MA in Economics students found a position within one year of graduation, and over 60 percent went on to earn annual salaries of \$100,000 or more.

There are other advantages to UMSL's MA in Economics program as well. We offer extensive coursework in applied economics and data analysis – five regularly-taught econometrics classes, for example, which is far more than most universities offer. These courses offer extensive hands-on experience with several software tools (SAS, R, Stata, Excel, Python, etc.). Students also gain practical knowledge through the completion of individual and group projects. Strong student-faculty relationships result from our small class sizes, as well as from hands-on learning from faculty who are enthusiastic about their classes and their related research. Our graduate research opportunities are exceptional as well. Students may work as research assistants on faculty research projects, as peer tutors in the Economic Resource Center, and collaborate on research projects through the UMSL student chapter of the National Association for Business Economics. The program can also accommodate those who wish to study part time as well.

2+3 BS/MA Dual Degree Program

The Master of Arts in Economics is also offered in a 2+3 program format which provides a pathway for students to earn both a bachelor's and a master's degree in economics with fewer total credit hours than would be required to complete each degree separately. Once all requirements have been met, students are awarded both a BS and an MA, enabling them to enter the job market with a competitive edge.
