Doctor of Philosophy in Education, Emphasis in Educational Psychology

UMSL provides a unique platform for students to pursue a doctorate in educational psychology. After completing the program's foundational courses, candidates can choose additional courses based upon their own interests to build their knowledge and skills by focusing on what they are interested in learning and doing in their current and future careers.

Of course, you may choose to practice as an educational psychologist upon completion of your degree. You may decide to work to develop and implement educational programs or help teachers create classroom curricula that enhance learning processes. You may prefer to work directly with families and children, with groups of people or with agencies and other organizations. You can also use your degree to teach at the college or university level, or to perform educational research to examine learning processes throughout all stages of life. With a PhD Emphasis in Educational Psychology from UMSL, your options are many and varied...all focused on helping others learn to succeed.

The PhD Emphasis in Educational Psychology program consists of a minimum of 90 hours of graduate coursework, including foundation courses (9-12 hours), research methods (15-18 hours), primary discipline courses (27-33 hours), and secondary discipline courses (12-15 hours). In addition, students must take a 3-hour exit course, complete a research internship and dissertation research.
