Our Mission

The mission of the University of Missouri-St. Louis Undergraduate Advising Program is to help students determine and fulfill their educational goals, achieve academically, and graduate in a timely manner. Throughout the collaborative advising process, the students' academic progress, and career and educational objectives are assessed. Students will learn how to take the initiative in academic planning and will develop the skills necessary to foster personal ambition, responsibility and leadership.

The Colleges' and Schools' individual academic advising programs and the Center for Student Success will work jointly to assist undergraduate students articulate the university's academic purposes and program requirements; gain information about majors, minors and certificate programs; and help students understand and negotiate the institution's academic requirements, rules, and academic opportunities.

Philosophy

We believe that academic advising at UMSL is an integral part of the learning process; that academic advising is more than planning a semester schedule and that academic advising is essential to the student's academic development, retention and graduation. Advising is a long-term partnership between the student and caring members of the UMSL community. As such, it is a collective effort that encourages the student to develop clear educational plans, choose realistic life /career goals, and engage in academic relationships with UMSL advisors and members of our support staff. To assist students in realizing their full potential at UMSL, staff and faculty advisors at UMSL embrace the following beliefs about academic advising:

New college students or transfer students to UMSL may be unaware of the demands and expectations of the university and therefore need to learn the culture. Academic advising plays a key role in students' understanding of the UMSL collegiate environment.

Academic advising is not an isolated event but an ongoing communication and relationship between the student and the advisor(s) in which a mutual trust and respect must be established.

Academic advisors recognize, respect and accept that all students are unique and enter the learning process at UMSL at varying points, and that students learn at different rates and through a variety of methods.

Academic advisors believe that every student at UMSL is important, whether the student is a "traditional" or "non-traditional" student, a declared or undeclared major, or a first-time college or transfer student.

Academic advisors at UMSL believe that while providing the student with the advising tools and correct information needed to achieve academic success, the *primary* responsibility for decision making rests with the student.

Student Learning Outcomes

Through the use of multiple campus resources and the advising experience at UMSL, students will have the opportunity to:

- Examine and develop an understanding of personal interests, skills and academic opportunities available.
- Develop and demonstrate the ability to make informed decisions regarding majors, minors, certificate programs, and graduate/professional programs that match the individual's academic interests, skills and career potentials and goals.
- Formulate a program-specific curriculum guide for achieving identified academic goals and select appropriate coursework for identified degree program(s).
- Utilize campus resources, student support services and referral programs to assist in the selection and completion of a realistic program-specific curriculum guide.
- Develop a relationship with the academic advisor(s) that will be vital to achieving academic goals; gaining information about careers, graduate study, and campus resources.
- Engage in classes and discipline-appropriate endeavors such as: internships, performances, practicum, clinical and on-site experiences that build academic potential; strengthen transferable skills; and increase personal communication and leadership abilities.
- Graduate in a timely manner based on educational plan and program requirements; seek assistance with questions and challenges while progressing through identified academic program(s).

The Advising Program

The advisor and student are engaged in a collaborative, respectful relationship and learning process with one another. Both the student and advisor have responsibilities in their shared partnership as noted below:

Advisors' Responsibilities:

- Be accessible to students during posted office hours, by telephone, or email.
- Explain the university's programs, requirements, policies and procedures.
- Provide timely and accurate information.
- Listen carefully to students' questions and concerns.
- Assist students in planning realistic programs consistent with their abilities and interests.
- Make referrals based on students' needs and available resources.
- Assess student progress and communicate it clearly.
- Encourage students to develop a collaborative, professional relationship with assigned advisor(s).

Students' Responsibilities:

- Contact advisors during posted office hours, by telephone, or email.
- Prepare a list of questions and/or concerns for each advising session.
- Acquire knowledge about the university's programs, requirements, policies and procedures.
- Provide honest, accurate information to the advisor such as: transfer credits, complete transcript information from other educational institutions, advanced credit, placement test results, etc.
- Clarify personal values and goals, and interact in the decision-making process.
- Follow through with suggestions, referrals and resources.
- Keep a record of academic progress, and accept responsibility for academic decisions and performance.
- Work to develop a mutual relationship with assigned advisor(s).

Campus Advising Resources and Information:

• Students have access to several resources on campus for selecting a major, discussing career options, and planning a curriculum appropriate to their needs, interests, and academic strengths. Through the advising program, students will develop a working relationship with assigned advisor(s).

- Students who are exploring majors work individually with advisors in the Center for Student Success and may utilize assessments to assist them in determining how their own personalities and interests can influence decisions regarding majors or career fields.
- Students who have selected majors should see the academic advisors in the college or school of the intended major. For several majors, faculty advising within the academic departments is also encouraged or required. Students who have questions or are uncertain about potential majors, dual majors, minors, certificates -- and the procedure to declare these programs -- may seek advisement in the advising office of their respective college or school (see web links below and additional office information provided in this syllabus):

College of Fine Arts and Communication

While the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Fine Arts and Communication are two separate colleges, professional advisors are available for BOTH units in one central location, 303 Lucas Hall. In general, these colleges apply

a three-tier approach to academic advising. At the first tier, most majors will meet with professional advisors for their first semester at UMSL (freshmen and transfer). At the beginning of the second semester and after, students are encouraged to be advised in the departments for their majors, the second tier. At this level with faculty advisors within the academic departments (often by appointment), though many students may continue to see professional advisors, too, as needed. Certain majors, however, are required to meet with their faculty/departmental advisors from the very first semester: Anthropology, Art Education, Biochemistry & Biotechnology, Chemistry and Biochemistry, Economics, Music, Physics and Astronomy, and Pre-Social Work and Social **Work.** The third tier includes advising for pre-law and pre-health sciences (e.g., pre-med, pre-dental, pre-optometry, pre-pharmacy, and pre-vet, etc). With regard to pre-professional studies, it is most helpful to see the appropriate pre-professional advisor in the first semester of the freshman year. Likewise, students seeking information and advice on certificate programs and centers within the colleges, should speak to a professional advisor for information and referrals.

All students seeking an undergraduate degree and/or teacher certification should consult an Academic Advisor prior to or during the first semester Level I courses are taken. Students should meet with an advisor at least once per semester.

Please note: Students may apply to the College of Education at the freshmen level. After 60 semester hours of college work with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher in all college-level coursework, pass the C-Base with a score of 235 or above and a documented ACT score, students are admitted to the Teacher Education Program. (See the UM-St. Louis Bulletin for complete list of requirements for formal admission to the Teacher Education Program or the link to Teacher Certification Programs Checklist above). Students must be in residence at UM-St. Louis for their last 30 semester hours to graduate and/or earn Missouri teacher certification.

APPOINTMENTS:

All undergraduate students in the nursing major are *required* to meet with an academic advisor from the College of Nursing each semester in order to register for classes.
