Clinical Experiences

On site teaching in an early clinical experience

20 clock hours working in a community agency

Two site-based practicum courses immersed in a Studio School

- Practicum I: 1 or 2 days per week working in a Studio School
- Practicum II: 4 or 5 days per week working in a Studio School. A secondary experience at an elementary or middle school experience are required.

Unique Resources and Innovations

Grand Seminars and Collaborative Exchanges throughout the practicum experiences.

Applicants for any post-baccalaureate alternative certification program must already hold a bachelor's degree with a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA. The 2.75 cumulative GPA is calculated using all college-level coursework taken. The cumulative GPA is a State of Missouri requirement for certification.
