Students participate in three break-out sessions that focus on improving writing skills and style. The writing festival concludes with a an open-mic sharing session to celebrate the students and the writing they have created throughout the day. You don't want to miss this opportunity!

- Registration Fee = \$25/per student

- Students and teachers should bring lunch.
- Transportation will not be provided by UMSL or GWP.
- Online Registration is open from Oct. 1 Oct. 27. You will register a total number of students via the online registration system. Individual student information needs to be provided via spreadsheet by Nov. 3.
- Registration is first come, first served. Space for this event may fill due to venue capacity. Please register early.

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Break-Out Session Descriptions

Session A-- Unlocking Your Inner Stories with Ms. Jen Maddock

Did you know you have a bank of hidden stories waiting inside you? We will work together on an activity that will reveal them so you can begin writing.

Session B--Two-Sentence Flash Fiction Halloween Scare Fest with Mr. Jason Carter

Simple statements pack a punch by tapping into what already exists within the reader. Intense emotion rises to the surface with just a few words: "She really loved you," "Please forgive me," "He's gone." Edgar Allan Poe related to contemporary fears and emotions to create terrifying stories and poems. Like Poe, we will write two-sentence horror stories that will scare us all with horrific brilliance.

Session C--Barbie-IRL with Ms. Megan O'Brien

Come on Barbie, let's go party! In the 2023 summer classic, Barbie leaves Barbieland for the real world. Your job is to tell us what happens next! You will be given the setting of where Barbie ends up and then the freedom to take it from there. Tell us what happens next in the story of Barbara Millicent Roberts.

Session D--Is a Picture Worth a Thousand Words? with Ms. Cathy O'Brien

You won't have to write 1,000 words in this session --- but be ready to let your poetic side be inspired by pieces of art. Creativity and imagination are highly encouraged!

Session E--If the Hat Fits, Wear It with Mr. Craig Bodenschatz

We will use props and journaling to develop short story elements. If you have trouble brainstorming ideas for themes and developing fictional characters, if you have trouble creating your own unique voice, if you need to explode a moment or create a backstory, look no further. Inventing your own individual brand as a writer may be as easy as changing hats.

Session F--It Is Written with Ms. Jasmin Easterling & Ms. Leslie Hamm

The world is a canvas for our self-expression, our stories, and our activism. We use writing in many different genres and mediums to respond to the world around us. In this session, we will learn about how writing has been used to tell some really powerful stories and make changes that shake the world. We will also create our own response to what we see around us.

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TEACHER CHECKLIST

- Get administrative approval to attend on Nov. 10. One teacher may attend free for every five paid registrations. We require one teacher for every 20 students.
- Secure transportation. If your students will be traveling by bus, determine travel time and route to the <u>EdCollabitat at UMSL</u>. Registration check-in is between 8:45 a.m. 9:15 a.m. The first break-out session begins at 9:30.
- Decide on a method of payment. (If parents are paying, then you will need to collect money when students return registration form.)
 - Schools may pay for all student registrations via credit card using our online registration system.
 - Schools may pay for all student registrations with school check or purchase order.

- Students may pay individually with personal check (made payable to University of Missouri-St. Louis). Teachers should collect registration fees from students and bring to the festival on Nov. 10 or mail to the address above. - Distribute registration forms to students. We recommend that you set a deadline for students to return the signed form (and payment, if students are paying individually). Due to capacity of our venue, we are limiting schools to a maximum of 20 students. Please keep in mind that this is a full day of writing. Students of any skill level are welcome; students who willingly engage with writing are recommended. **All signed student registration forms must be brought to the festival with you on Nov. 10.**
