Application Requirements

- 1. Graduate School Application http://umsl.edu/go/Apply-Now
- 2. Transcripts and/or Entrance examinations
 - a. Official transcripts from all universities attended are required
 - b. International applicants are required to document English proficiency by providing scores from an internationally accepted standardized examination before a decision is made on admission.
- 3. Grade Point Average
 - a. Minimum of 2.75 on 4.0 scale in undergraduate categories and 3.00 in graduate work.

Application Deadlines

Applications are processed as they are submitted. However, applications that are not received by the posted date may be delayed admission until the following term.

- Fall term: July 1
- Spring term: December 1
- Summer term: May 1
