Papers, memorabilia, publications of longtime writer and editorial journalist for *The Waterways Journal*, a major trade newspaper for the inland waterways commercial and recreational industry.

Note: the papers and manuscripts were rescued out of a dilapidated environment and underwent significant appraisal and neutralization for dust, and further decimation.

Highlights of the collection are a large selection of vintage travel ephemera from the twentieth century; typescripts and notes related to personal travel in the United States; inland waterways trade conference reporting and documentation; and general historical material for St. Louis and the nation as especially intertwined with American river history.

The collection is divided into the following ten subject groups organized at the box level only as a first sort, in nearly 130 boxes.
