You've been admitted to UMSL! Below are the next steps you must take to become a Triton.



LOGIN TO YOUR TRITON PORTAL AND REGISTER FOR ORIENTATION

- REQUIRED – Sign in to the Triton Portal and Register for Orientation:** The Triton Portal serves as a one-stop function, outlining your admissions status and admitted next steps. Use this portal, to view your SSO username, student number, password, and UMSL email address. Your Triton Portal shows a personalized checklist that includes financial aid, an advising pre-questionnaire, orientation events, your student success team, and much more.

To login, visit umsl.edu/tritonportal - you will use your email and password that was used on your UMSL application.

To register for orientation, click on the advising and orientation tab in your Triton Portal:

1. Complete a pre-advising questionnaire, select your orientation event, and register your guests
2. Transfer students will have an online option for orientation
3. In order to finalize your schedule and register for classes, you must meet with your academic advisor
4. Once you select your orientation event, you will receive an email confirmation with your next steps



FINAL TRANSCRIPTS:

- To ensure that your academic record is complete for your admission to UMSL, send your final transcripts once your grades and diploma or degree are posted.

Send an official electronic copy of your final transcripts to admissions@umsl.edu

If unable to send transcripts via your previous institution's registrar, use options such as National Student Clearinghouse, Parchment, or eScript-Safe.

UNDERSTAND TUITION AND FEES

- Tuition is the cost to attend a class at the University of Missouri-St. Louis. At UMSL, we aim to keep our tuition as low as possible while providing a quality education. Here are some quick facts about tuition:
 - Tuition costs vary depending on the number of credit hours you take
 - To be considered a full-time student you must register for 12 or more credit hours (approximately three to four classes)
 - If you are registered for less than 12 credit hours, you will be considered a part-time student

NOTE: If you enroll in courses, but do NOT attend UMSL, you will still be held responsible for tuition and fees associated with those courses unless you officially withdraw from the University.

UMSL Net Price Calculator:

To provide students and families with estimates on the total cost of attendance for UMSL. The estimated grant aid package determined by the calculator is based upon averages of grant and awarded to college students in particular income ranges that attended UMSL in previous academic years. The calculator will review the student's information for potential admissions scholarships.

UMSL Fee Estimator:

This allows students to estimate their out of pocket expenses needed for a single semester. It will also estimate the monthly minimum payment options for each due date. The estimate is based on current tuition, fee and housing information and requires the student to know the amount of aid they are awarded for the semester.
