\$12 Million Project Brings 36 New Affordable Homes To Pagedale

Beyond Housing news

Housing construction rarely starts in winter. But general contractor Roanoke Construction and the rest of the team behind Pagedale Town Center Homes were so eager to get started on the \$12 million project that they jumped into action.... The timeline is just one more in a long list of unique characteristics for the project to build 36 new single-family affordable homes....They're scheduled to be complete in early 2025.... Pagedale Mayor Faye Millet couldn't be more delighted that construction is underway.

This is the 20th low-income housing tax credit project Beyond Housing has completed since 1988. Kevin Buchek, President of Roanoke Construction, worked on many of those with Beyond Housing at a previous employer. "This is the first of what we hope will be many partnerships between Roanoke and Beyond Housing," he said. "It is a natural collaboration as both companies are headquartered in the 24:1 footprint and both are focused on building and developing quality affordable housing." Buchek grew up in Bel-Nor and located Roanoke's headquarters in Normandy because he wants to see the 24:1 Community thrive. He's also very committed to a high standard for minority- and women-owned business participation, currently projected at 22% and 7%, respectively. Read more.

The organic cold-pressed juice company was a member of the third cohort of UMSL's Anchor Accelerator, which supports diverse founders from underrepresented communities through a non-dilutive \$50,000 capital injection. The event was organized by Jacqueline McNair, director of the college's Student Services, and Linda Stein, student service coordinator, as a way to start students off with a healthy new year while also supporting vendors in UMSL's own community. Lambert brings billions to the St. Louis region. A new study shows just how much

St. Louis Public Radio, Eric Schmid, January 29, 2024

St. Louis' Lambert International Airport is a cornerstone of the local economy and likely to play a key role in driving future regional growth, according to a new economic impact study released today. The report by Kimley-Horn and Associates and prepared for Greater St. Louis Inc. finds the airport supports a total of 102,815 jobs and drives \$27.5 billion in economic impact. Those figures could grow to 133,501 and \$32.4 billion in 2032 respectively.... Put another way, Lambert today drives 5.5% of the St. Louis region's gross domestic product, and that could expand to 7% in the next eight years. It's a figure Rhonda Hamm-Niebruegge, the airport's director, finds staggering. Read more.
