




Happy Holidays

65+ Years Old for Inaugural Senior Scholars Program UMSL is taking its commitment to educating the regional

community to a new level with the Senior Scholars program. A

cohort of 30 Senior Scholars will participate in the pilot effort. They will take part in a full-day orientation retreat in January, enroll in one college level course of their choosing, and participate in monthly discussion review sessions as a large group. Senior Scholars enrolled during the pilot period will serve as informal advisors for the program on how to best structure and market the program in the future. Spring 2018 pilot participants will receive a full scholarship to take part. The only out of pocket cost will be for books and other learning materials required in a given class. 
